THEIR HOCKEY RECORD

Glasgow University Beat Belfast Rivals

Glasgow University, 4; Queen's College, Belfast, 3

Glasgow University maintained their unbeaten record in the inter-Varsity series by beating Queen's College, Belfast, by the odd goal in seven after a keen game at Westerlands yesterday.

The Irish defence resisted two determined attacks in the early stages, and from a clearance Miss Hunter scored the first goal. Almost immediately Miss Roalston added a second for the visitors following a corner.

The College continued to press hard, and Miss Jamieson in the home goal was called on several times. Towards the interval Glasgow took up the attack, and Miss Pearson found the net after several of the forwards had tried. Most of the play after the interval favoured the College, but in a break-away Miss Pearson scored with a hard drive to bring the scores level, and Miss Taylor gave the University the lead.

The Irish forwards were very effective in the outfield, but could not break through a stubborn defence in which the halves gave very good support to the backs. Miss Pearson put the Glasgow side further ahead, but before the end the College reduced the leeway through Miss Hunter.

The visitors revealed better stickwork. All their forwards were clever, the two wing players being particularly prominent. The University played better than for some time past, the halves being particularly effective. They supported the forwards well and also gave good help to the backs. Miss Stewart was outstanding at right inner, but all worked with a good understanding.
