THE GARDEN PARTY.

Colourful Scene in the Quadrangle.

In the quadrangle of the University there was yesterday a scene as gay in spirit as the most casual garden party. The Pro-Chancellor of the University, Lord Justice Andrews, and Mrs. Andrews gave this "At Home" in the absence of the Marquis of Londonderry, the Chancellor. The academic gowns of students and professors mingled with summer frocks of the women visitors. Guests passed through the Great Hall, which was decorated with roses and delphinium from Mrs. Andrews' garden, and joined the ever moving mass of people on the lawn.

Lord Justice Andrews and Mrs. Andrews received the guests. Mrs. Andrews was in a distinctive two-piece of black crepe romaine, the gown cut on Princess lines, and the coat the new three-quarter length, having short sleeves cuffed with fox. Broderie anglaise worked at the neckline of coat and gown formed the only trimming. Her black turtle straw picture hat was edged with tulle and finished with a spray of candias at one side.

Mrs. J. M. Andrews had a tunic of green, black and grey checked silk with her black silk suit. A small black Bangkok straw hat completed her ensemble. Mrs. W. F. Ogilvie chose a three-quarter coat of indigo wool georgette, the caped sleeves bordered with dyed fox fur to tone, over a gown of white and blue flowered silk. Her basket straw picture hat was to tone.

Lady Campbell was in ciel blue. Lady Davison chose a black satin gown made with a matching shoulder cape, and a small black straw hat.

Mrs. R. A. Mitchell's black crepe gown had a ruffle collar of black and white ostrich feather tips and white bead embroidery on the wide sleeves. Mrs. Newton Anderson had a navy coat over a navy and white spotted silk frock. Mrs. Houston had a black quilted taffeta coatee with her black floral silk gown.

SAPPHIRE BLUE.

Lady Moore had a sapphire blue embossed georgette tunic with a sapphire blue skirt, a caped coat of sapphire blue velvet, and a Dolly Varden hat of navy straw tied with lighter blue ribbons. Logan (president of the Irish Federation of University Women and hon. secretary of the University Women's Club) chose white silk patterned in coral and navy in a leaf design. Mrs. Maynard Sinclair chose navy patterned crepe-de-chine. Mrs. S. Irwin chose navy floral silk.

Mrs. Courtenay Shillington's black and white floral chiffon gown was worn with a three-quarter length black coat and a small black straw hat. Mrs. Graham Shillington had a forget-me-not blue coat and hat with her floral silk gown. Mrs. Rives Shillington had a black picture hat with her black and rose patterned silk frock. Mrs. W. Andrews had a navy coat over a navy and white silk gown. Mrs. Lloyd Dodd had a knee-length navy coat over a printed silk gown. Miss Muriel Earls wore a frock of beech brown and beige spotted taffeta made with a wide skirt and short puff sleeves. Miss R. Barbour chose one of the new caped suits in a delicate maize wool romaine, relieved with touches of scarlet at the neck. A maize halo hat completed her ensemble. Mrs. Llubera had a black coat over a gown of black and white floral chiffon, with a black picture hat.
