Friends and acquaintances:

Though most of you know me, for those who do not, I am a retired emeritus professor of the California Institute of Technology who also served that institution at various times as Dean of Students, as Department Head and as Vice-President for Student Affairs. I am also a long-time friend of Jorg Imberger and have, in recent years, been an annual visitor to the Centre for Water Research.

I arrived in Perth several days ago anxious to learn what could possibly have led to Jorg's suspension from the University of Western Australia and his banishment from the campus. Jorg is one of the most highly regarded faculty members at UWA and for him to be treated in such an egregious way seemed to me to be nothing short of incredible. I have been most anxious to try to determine the background to this matter but this has been made extremely difficult by the veil of secrecy and confidentiality imposed by the UWA administration. However, I have been able to ascertain that the reasons behind the administrative actions are associated with complaints extracted from three recent students. Rumor has it that these complaints were, in part, extracted by administrative coercion (as a part of a review of CWR) rather than voluntary action on the part of the students. It appears that the entire UWA student grievance process was arbitrarily bypassed by the University. Subsequently, an independent external administrator was asked by the University to examine the allegations and dismissed all but one of the complaints, a relatively minor complaint which, in my opinion, could have been readily resolved through local, informal processes as laid out in the UWA student grievance procedures. I think all of us in academia have, from time to time, had to deal with occasional complaints from students that are usually resolved in this way using procedures, informal and formal, laid out in a well-thought-out Student Grievance Process such as that in place at UWA.

The effect on Jorg has been devastating to say nothing of the effect on the CWR staff and students who are 100% behind him. The effect on the University reputation will also be very negative especially since two other senior professors in a completely different department have been subject to the same autocratic treatment by several individuals in the UWA administration that need to be held accountable for their malfeasance. The procedures used need to be examined by an independent faculty/staff committee and appropriate action taken against the administration officials who perpetrated the aforementioned coercion.

I have prepared this email because many of you have, with similar incredulity, asked me to find out what I can during my stay in Perth. What I ask of you now is to give me your encouragement and support to seek a meeting with the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Paul Johnson (Paul.johnson@uwa.edu.au) in order to express the concerns of Jorg's international community of friends and to ask the Vice-Chancellor to do what he can to resolve the matter before the reputations of both Jorg and the University suffer irreversible harm. I also encourage you to email the Vice-Chancellor if you wish to do so.

CWR is an extraordinary academic institution that has made major contributions to our knowledge of water systems around the world and it would be a tragedy to lose its potential future contributions in the internationally critical area of water resources. If you do communicate with the Vice-Chancellor you could do great service to the cause by emphasizing how important CWR has been in the past and can be in the future.

Please let me have your reactions as soon as possible since action is needed now and I am hoping to meet with the Vice-Chancellor this coming week.

Uni shuts water study centre

The University of WA has shut the world-renowned research organisation set up by acclaimed water expert Jorg Imberger as part of an increasingly bitter dispute between the pair, a leading academic has claimed.

More than four months after UWA's management stood down Professor Imberger amid a probe into his conduct, it has emerged that on Friday the university closed the Centre for Water Research he started 33 years ago.

The decision, which UWA re-

fused to comment on yesterday, has sent shock waves through the academic community locally and overseas, and prompted a fierce defence of Professor Imberger's record.

In an email sent by Christopher Brennen, a retired emeritus professor from the California Institute of Technology, UWA's decision was described as inexplicable and "self-destructive".

Professor Brennen's email, a copy of which has been obtained by *The West Australian*, also suggests Professor Imberger was notified of the decision during a

meeting with UWA Vice-Chancellor Paul Johnson. It claimed the decision was to take effect "permanently" and "immediately", with Professor Imberger and Associate Professor Clelia Marti to be moved to an existing academic department at the university.

"The reason he (Professor Johnson) gave for this action was that the centre was 'not sustainable'," Professor Brennen wrote.

"It seems that the numerous letters he received from all over the world lauding the work of CWR were not sufficient to demonstrate to the vice-chancellor

the enormous value of the centre and its work to one of the most important environmental problems of our time and, in particular, the contribution of the centre to the international reputation of UWA.

"Why he would take such self-destructive action is beyond me."

Claims the centre was not sustainable come despite a submission Professor Imberger is believed to have made in which he said the centre had brought in \$350 million of funding to UWA since 1982.

Revelations of the centre's closure also come ahead of a review

by a panel of academic peers scheduled to take place today that will look at the findings of the university into complaints made against Professor Imberger.

The former WA Scientist of the Year was stood down on full pay in November after UWA initiated an investigation into serious misconduct allegations against him.

Professor Imberger, who has worked at UWA for 50 years, has launched Federal Court proceedings under fair work laws, alleging the university has denied him procedural fairness and contravened the Fair Work Act.

Closure of the Centre for Water Research

Closure of the Centre for Water Research

Following an independent external review of the performance of the Centre for Water Research (CWR) which found that the Centre has failed to meet the performance criteria for a research centre at the University of Western Australia, the University has decided to close the Centre for Water Research.

UWA research centres are each expected to have a minimum of six full-time equivalent academic staff actively engaged in research activities, to be financially self-sustaining, and to foster strong collaborative linkages both within the UWA community and externally with society at large.

The Centre for Water Research contains two academic staff, does not cover its operational costs, has an accumulated operating deficit of \$3.22 million, and has little interaction with academic units within UWA or with major external water resource organisations.

The external review found that 'the Centre does not appear to meet the fundamental criteria for a Centre as described in the 2011 policy guidance of the University. It fails on qualities of scale, collaboration with UWA peers and sustainability.'

The Review Report noted that 'CWR, especially in the period of this Review

Water Centre millions in the red: UWA

WA's most prestigious university has opened up about its decision to axe a world-renowned water research centre, saying it operated at a loss, lacked academic grunt and was not collaborative.

Fresh from revelations it had closed the Centre for Water Research set up by top scientist Jorg Imberger in 1982, the University of WA yesterday released a statement outlining its reasons.

According to UWA, the move was based on an external review that found "the Centre does not appear to meet the fundamental criteria for a Centre as described in the 2011 policy guidance of the university".

"It fails on qualities of scale, collaboration with UWA peers and sustainability," it said.

The university said its research centres were supposed to have at least six full-time academics "actively engaged in research initiatives" but the CWR had just two.

These were believed to be Professor Imberger and Associate Professor Clelia Marti, both of whom UWA has said it will move to another academic department.

The university also said the CWR

had an "accumulated operating deficit" of \$3.22 million, making it unsustainable.

And it said unlike other centres the CWR had failed to collaborate with other academic units at the university or with "major external water resources" bodies.

On top of this, UWA claimed the review had recommended the CWR be investigated over "consistent and extensive claims of 'unacceptable behaviour and treatment of both staff and students by their CWR supervisors'".

Christopher Brennan, a retired emeritus professor from the California Institute of Technology, dismissed as "bureaucratic counting" the need for centres to have six academics.

Professor Brennan said it beggared belief UWA could claim the CWR lacked academic standing when Professor Imberger was an international authority on some water issues.

He also said it was "dubious" to claim the centre failed to collaborate given it had a "tremendous" reputation worldwide, while allegations of misconduct were inconsistent with his experience with the CWR.

Professor on hiding to nothing

Professor Jorg Imberger has clearly bruised a few egos in a 50-year academic career which has been hanging by a thread after the axing of his internationally acclaimed Centre for Water Research at the University of WA.

Professor Imberger can be a blunt instrument and is known for speaking his mind, but that is what universities used to be all about.

And maybe it's what is really behind the apparent academic lynching of this 72-year-old winner of the world's biggest award in his field, the Stockholm Water Prize.

Professor Imberger doesn't suffer fools — or even very smart people acting like fools — lightly.

After three months of secrecy, UWA has started justifying what has appeared to be the case since last October: that it intended to close the centre and as leverage to that process pursue Imberger on historic disciplinary matters not previously raised.

A UWA statement confirming the closure was, in itself, remarkable because everything in it is either contradicted or brought into serious question by CWR's submission to the review of its functions. It exposed a

curious situation in which UWA prefers its academics to sit on Australian government advisory boards rather than conduct the extensive international collaborations which have brought CWR its global reputation.

Similarly, its claim that the centre has only two academic staff when its 2011 policy requires six seems needlessly proscriptive given the nine adjunct teaching and research academics at CWR.

But the university's claim that the centre has an accumulated operating deficit of \$3.22 million and is unsustainable is the most egregious, a selective use of data which would not be acceptable if

handed in by an undergraduate.

For example, a small operating deficit last year was more than covered by a \$516,000 net return to the administration the previous year. The centre's review submission showed projected surpluses this year and for every year to 2019 when CWR's revenue was anticipated to peak at \$7 million, against current operating costs of about \$2.1 million.

The writing was on the wall at the end of October when UWA administrators stripped the Professor of Environmental Engineering's students from the centre.

And now they will be able to strip the substantial assets that

Professor Imberger has built up since launching CWR in 1982.

Associate Professor Ben Hodges from the University of Texas at Austin was a post-doctoral fellow at CWR from 1997-2000, moving then to Stanford.

"The work of the CWR team is internationally known, internationally respected, and is the first place that other researchers go to develop systemic understanding," Hodges told the UWA review.

"In contrast to the explosion of 'publish or perish' papers that are eminently forgettable across much of the literature, CWR can be proud of its record of publishing important papers.

"As a tenured professor at an internationally known university, I watch with trepidation the financialisation of research and the increasing requirements for professors to act as 'revenue generating units' for the university at large.

"This trend is slowly squeezing the life out of creative research, discouraging the best and brightest from research careers, and changing the focus from 'what science is important for tomorrow' to 'what will pay the bill today'."

"No one asks a literature professor for a cut from a book advance, but there are no qualms about taking an increasingly large share of overhead fees generated by research professors while simultaneously diminishing the real support for what overhead

is supposed to cover: equipment, offices, laboratories, support staff and funds for creative research initiation.

"If there is any question as to the financial sustainability of the Centre, then UWA needs to ask itself: what is UWA doing for CWR to earn the overhead money UWA receives?"

Two weeks ago, I asked UWA whether senior deputy vice-chancellor Dawn Freshwater, previously in charge of "organisational effectiveness" at the University of Leeds, was recruited specifically at the end of 2013 to drive a similar process here.

"Of course, the position of SDVC role includes senior management responsibilities including the functional review, also line management of deans and some business units," UWA replied.

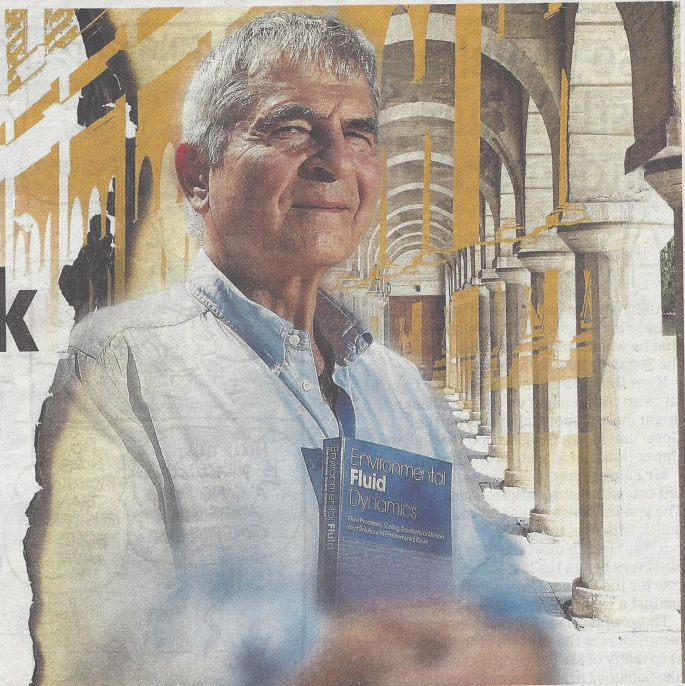
Ms Freshwater caught the attention of the London Times higher education supplement in 2012, winning its academic jargon competition for this explanation of organisational effectiveness:

"We can reframe the way we define it, so that it's not viewed as simply foregrounding cost savings, but instead a much more complex interplay of influences and drivers that facilitate opportunities for enhancing the ways in which we manage movement."

Frankly, up against that, the centre started by the blunt-speaking Professor Imberger never stood a chance.

Even the rebuke of a Federal Court judge in December who was surprised that somebody of Professor Imberger's standing could be suspended by a letter that gave no indication of the nature of the allegations against him has not prised open UWA's star chamber approach.

That bid for an injunction against the suspension failed because of the tight terms of UWA's enterprise bargaining agreement which academics must sign for their employment.

Since receiving that letter on November 17 from senior deputy vice-chancellor Dawn Freshwater — the name's a bitter irony in this murky saga — Professor Imberger has effectively been banished from the campus where he worked for 50 years and established the celebrated Centre for Water Research in 1982.

The reviews come under the control of Professor Freshwater,

who was hired at the end of 2013 from the University of Leeds where she was pro vice-chancellor for staff and organisational effectiveness. Penetrating the veil of secrecy has not been easy, mainly because breaches of university confidentiality invoke notice of further disciplinary action which have Professor Imberger's colleagues and local supporters running scared.

But as chance has it, one of the beleaguered academic's old friends, Christopher Brennan, a retired emeritus professor from the California Institute of Technology, is on an annual visit to the CWR.

Professor Brennan once served as Dean of Students at Caltech and is horrified by what he has been able to uncover about UWA's processes involving his friend and the research centre he has built.

"News travels fast," Professor Brennan noted this week. "When the story of Jorg's suspension went online, 95 per cent of my academic friends would assume there's only a couple of reasons why someone would be suspended like that.

"And they're gross sexual harassment, felonious use of university funds and the other would be physical threats.

"Everyone has been thinking he must have done something like

this. Of course, none of that is true."

In fact, Professor Brennan says the suspension is far removed from those perceptions, involving conversational issues raised by three students, all Muslim.

"There are some minor complaints," he said.

"In one of them Jorg might have said to this young woman something about praying so much at the centre, which may not have been wise. But that could have been dealt with in the normal grievance processes.

"Things that are said by faculty that might be inappropriate can be dealt with without publicity and resolved.

"I have not been privy to any documents I should not have seen, but people have talked to me and I've been able to form a picture of what's happened.

"And I've been told that an independent investigator who has evaluated what were about a dozen initial complaints has only partly upheld three of them.

"I'm told he found there was no religious intolerance in any of the comments."

Professor Brennan said he learnt the only remaining complaints came from the three Islamic students with whom he had some contact during a visit to

Perth last year. In an email to UWA vice-chancellor Paul Johnson seeking a meeting, Professor Brennan raised specific concerns from the independent investigator's report into the full suite of "serious misconduct" allegations detailed after the November 17 letter.

He also raised the issue of whether disciplinary action brought during the review of a research centre was being used as leverage on academics.

In his response on Tuesday, Professor Johnson said he could not discuss the issues with third parties "for the benefit of Professor Imberger's privacy".

"As vice-chancellor, I am not a part of the current review process and should not intervene in pending proceedings," Professor Johnson said. "The ultimate findings on this matter are confidential between the university and Professor Imberger."

Professor Brennan says it is highly irregular for student complaints to be made part of a research centre review process. It would not happen at Caltech.

Professor Imberger is facing a similar situation to Professor Ian Dadour and Professor John Watling whose Centre for Forensic Science has also been under

review since August and who were suspended in November for disciplinary reasons.

The CFS was found to be financially unsustainable by a UWA internal review last year, but CWR is said to be self-funding, claiming to have contributed \$3.5 million to university revenues between 2006-14.

In response to 16 questions I asked this week which UWA mainly declined to answer on the grounds of confidentiality, it made its first public comment on the Imberger allegations, saying it had received several complaints from students and staff about "bullying, harassment and other claims of misconduct".

There was no mention of the "serious misconduct" which was asserted in the court proceedings.

The university denied its review committee actively sought student complaints.

"The university is treating these allegations seriously, in accordance with its zero tolerance approach to bullying and other inappropriate behaviour," a spokesman said.

"Professor Imberger has elected to seek a review of a finding by the university as to some of the complaints and this is to be reviewed by a panel of his academic peers on March 23."

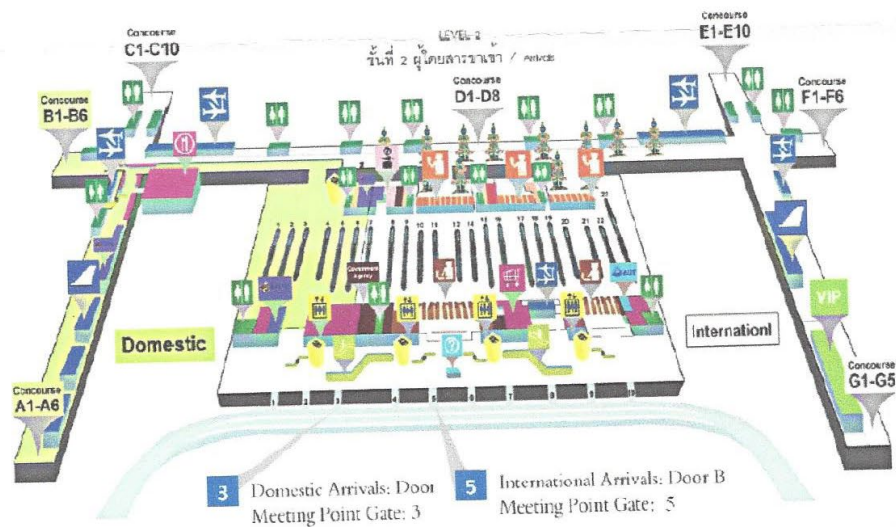




The Grand Palace complex was established in 1782 and it consists of not only the royal residence and throne halls, but also a number of government offices as well as the renowned Temple of the Emerald Buddha. It covers an area of 218,000 square metres and is surrounded by four walls, 1900 metres in length.

After King Rama I ascended to the throne in 1782, the palace was built. Prior to this, the royal palace and centre of administration had been located in Thonburi, on the west side of the Chao Phraya River. For various reasons, the new king considered the former capital to be unsuitable and decided to establish a new capital on the other side of the river. By his royal command, a new palace was built to serve not only as his residence but also as the site of administrative offices. The royal compound has been known since then as the Grand Palace. The two earliest structures erected within the complex were the Dusit Maha Prasat Throne Hall, and the Phra Maha Monthian.



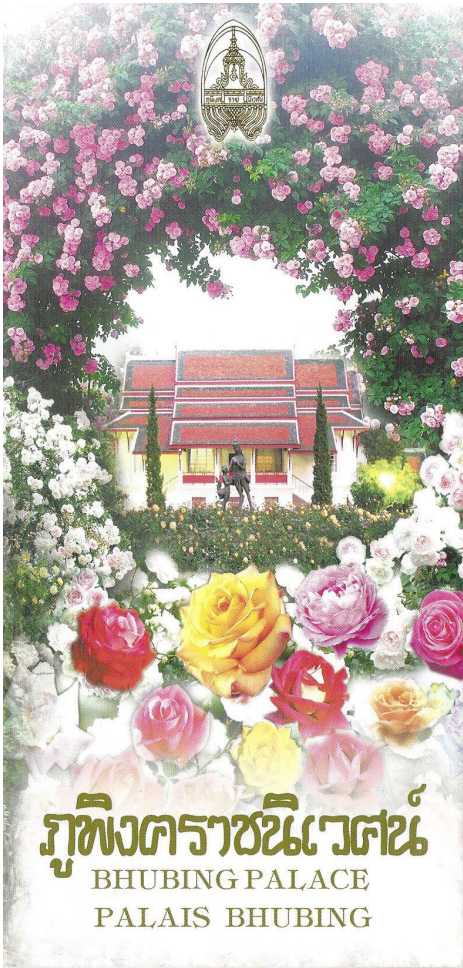

The Bhubing Palace

Bhubing Rajanives was built in Central Thai architectural style called "Reun Mu" (Group of Houses). The building sits on stilts. The upper floor is the royal residential area while the ground floor houses the royal entourage. The building master plan was designed by Prince Samaichaleerm Kridagara while the building was undertaken by Mom Rachawongse Mitrarun Kasemsri. The construction of the Palace was undertaken by the Crown Property Bureau, under the supervision of Prince Samaichaleerm Kridagara, assisted by Mom Rachawongse Mitrarun Kasemsri and Mr. Pradit Yuwapukka. General Luang Kampanath Saenyakorn, the Privy Councilor was assigned to lay foundation stones on 24 August 1961 at 10.49 hrs. The Construction took 5 months to complete. The first royal visitors to stay at the Palace were King Frederick the Ninth and Queen Ingrid of Denmark on their royal visit to Thailand in January 1962.

Bhubing Rajanives a été construit en style thaï traditionnel appelé (Groupe de maisons). Pha Mon Pavilion and Fern Garden



Pha Mon Pavilion and Fern Garden Originally a small hill covered with existing plants and trees where a hill-tribe style thatched-roofed bamboo hut was built for royal recreation and informal dinner. A teak wood pavilion was later built in place of the bamboo hut.

The Fern Garden was started in 1993 when various indigenous varieties of ferns were collected and planted in harmony with the natural surroundings.

Some of the ferns, tree ferns of cyatheaceae family are as old as 60-100 years.

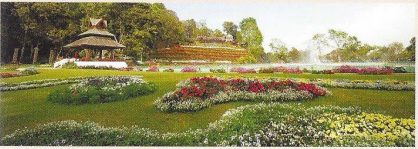

Water Reservoir

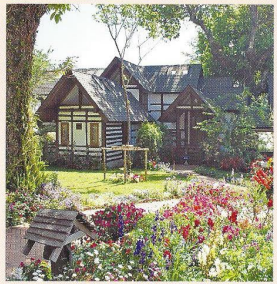

There is the musical Fountain called "The Fountain of Celestial Water of People".

Eucalyptus Cottage 1

The Eucalyptus cottage 1 built according to the royal instruction of Her Majesty the Queen who wished to study the use of eucalyptus wood in construction of buildings. It was a log cabin built by a military engineering company from the Third Army Division. The design was by Mr. Kitti Kupatavinij architect who also supervised the construction work that started on 5 September 1991. The foundation stones were laid by General Prem Tinasulanonda, the Privy Councilor who acted on the royal instruction on 12 September 1991. The construction was completed in January 1992.

city in 1296, King Mangrai built his "golden palace" in the northern sector including Wat Chiang Man. In front of the important chedi is a large viham. The standing Buddha on the right of the altar is dated 1465. In the next building on the right, two rare small images are locked behind protective glass. One is a gilded black stone seated Buddha, Indian and about 8th - 10th century. The other is Phra Sae Tang Khamani, a small quartz carving in "bhumiaparsa" (overcoming evil) pose, retained by King Mangrai after capturing 9th century Haripunchai in 1281.

The newly built "silver temple" at Wulai Road is situated next to the old viham where inside you can see a masterly collection of "repousse" silverwork. Nowadays this craft is fashioned in an alloy of aluminum, copper and zinc but still with traditionally fine artistry. Turning right out of friendly Wat Srisuphan across Wulai Road, 500 meters straight on is Wat Muensan and the Silver Museum.

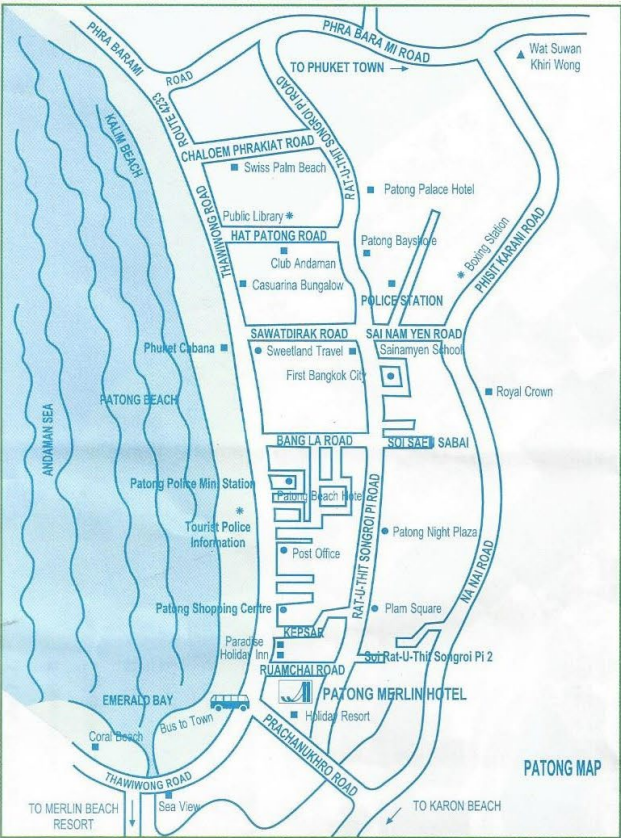



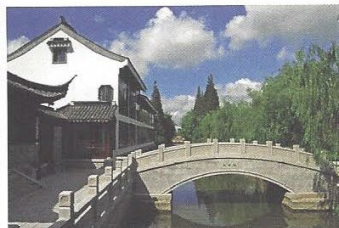

中山陵 (ZhongShanLing, The Mausoleum of Dr. Sun Yat-sen)

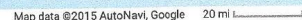
The Dr Sun Yat-sen Mausoleum was built in 1926 in honor of Dr. Sun Yat-sen (1866-1925), who is recognized as the Father of Modern China. He led the rebellion against the corrupt Qing government resulting in the 1911 revolution which put and end the feudal system. In turn, the Republic of China was founded. The mausoleum is situated at the foot of the south face of **Purple Mountain**, and it has become a must-see tourist destination for all visitors to Nanjing. The construction of the mausoleum is symmetrical, and it serves as a fine example of classical and modern beauty. Entering the mausoleum in sequence is the torii, the corridor, the gateway, the monument, the memorial hall, and finally the tomb. A long stone stairway of 392 steps leads up to the tomb which lies at the rear of the memorial chamber. Outside the memorial chamber there is a tablet featuring the inscription of the "Three Principles of the People": nationalism, democracy and people's livelihood, which were formulated by Dr. Sun. Inside the hall stand black granite poles and a statue of Dr. Sun sculpted from white marble. Within the tomb a prostrate marble statue of Sun seals his coffin, which was buried five meters underground.

总统府 (ZongTongFu, Nanjing Presidential Palace)

During the 1009 years from 1840 to 1949, it was the backbone of the Chinese military and politics. The Presidential Palace is now a historic site with great importance in modern history of China. And it is now the biggest modern history museum in China.

In the early *Ming Dynasty*, the Nanjing Presidential Palace was the *Palace of King Han*. In the *Qing Dynasty*, it became the office of the *Viceroy of Liangjiang*, the chief government official in charge of what is today *Jiangsu, Anhui* and *Jiangxi*. It was also the residence for *Emperor Kangxi* and *Qianlong* when they visit the south region of the Yangtze River. In 1853, *Taiping Revolution* forces led *Hong Xiuquan* occupied Nanjing. The palace was expanded and converted into a palace for Hong, the *Palace of the Heavenly King*. In 1864, Qing imperial forces re-took Nanjing and the Commander *Zeng Guofan* ordered that most of the palace be razed. After the *Xinhai Revolution* in 1911, *Sun Yat-sen* was sworn in at the Presidential Palace as the provisional President of the Republic of China. During the 50 years after the revolution of Nanjing, the Presidential Palace was the office for the government institution. The Presidential Palace covers an area of 90000 square meters, which can be divided into three parts, namely the central part, the western part and the eastern part. There are sites of the *Nationalist Government* and the Presidential Palace in the central part, the *Office of the Provisional President*, *Secretariat* and the *Department of Staffs* in the western part and the *Executive Yuan*, *Stable* and *East Garden* in the east.

Some of the architectures in the palace are with classic style while some are combination of the Chinese and western style. However, all of them can reflect a period of Chinese history. Visiting the palace, you will get more about the modern history of China.

Located by the Dishui Lake of Lingang New City, Pudong New Area, China Maritime Museum is the only national maritime museum approved by the State Council of the People's Republic of China and was established by the State Ministry of Transport and Shanghai Municipal Government. The Museum occupies a land area of 24,830 square meters and a floor space of 46,434 square meters. The indoor display area is 21,000 square meters, while the outdoor display area is 6,000 square meters.

As the largest and the highest level comprehensive maritime museum in China, the Museum covers cultural relics collection, academic research, social education, display, exhibition, popular science, etc. With "navigation" as the mainstream and "wide collection" as the basis, the Museum is divided into six exhibition halls: Hall of Chinese Navigation History, Hall of Ships, Hall of Navigation and Ports, Hall of Maritime Affairs and Sea Safety, Hall of Seafarers and Hall of Navy, as well as two specific exhibition zones, namely Fishery Zone and Marine Sports & Recreation Zone. In addition, the Museum also has a spherical planetarium, a 4D Movie Theater, and a Children's Center.

🌟 Hall of Chinese Navigation History

The Hall of Chinese Navigation History is located at the east side of level 1, chronologically divided into the ancient, modern and contemporary sections. With technology as the hidden line, the Hall displays the invention and evolution of China's nautical technology through the introduction to shipbuilding and navigation technologies, such as floating objects, dugout canoes, plank boats, sails, paddles, sculls, rudders, compasses, etc.

🌟 Hall of Ships

The Hall of Ships, located at the west side of level 1, gives you a clear picture of ships through demonstration of ship structure, marine equipment and ship building process. Moreover, the various ship models will widen your knowledge about ships.

🌟 Hall of Seafarers

Huangshan (simplified Chinese: 黄山; traditional Chinese: 黃山; pinyin: *Huángshān*; literally: "Yellow Mountains"),^[2] is a mountain range in southern Anhui province in eastern China. Vegetation on the range is thickest below 1,100 meters (3,600 ft), with trees growing up to the treeline at 1,800 meters (5,900 ft).

The area is well known for its scenery, sunsets, peculiarly shaped granite peaks, Huangshan Pine trees, hot springs, winter snow, and views of the clouds from above. Huangshan is a frequent subject of traditional Chinese paintings and literature, as well as modern photography. It is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and one of China's major tourist destinations. Huangshan is also the famous place for Chinese high quality teas, such as Huangshan Maofeng, Keemun Black and Blooming Tea.

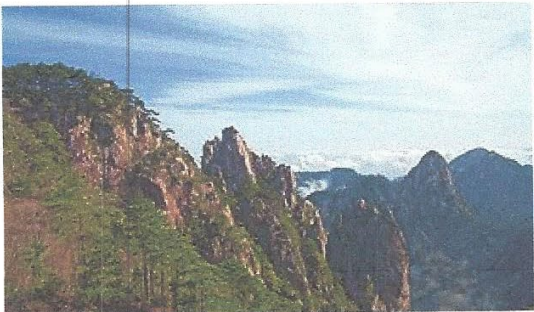

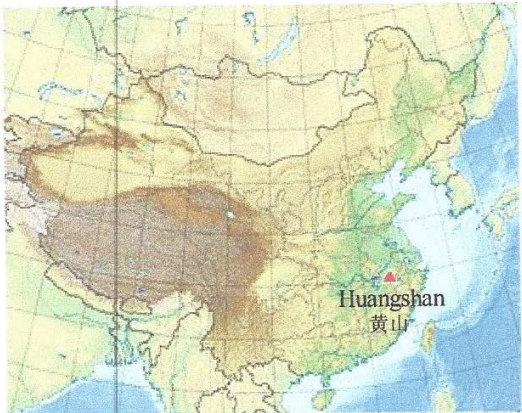

Huangshan mountain range has many peaks, some more than 1,000 meters (3,250 feet) high.^[7] The three smallest and best-known peaks are *Lotus Peak* (Lian Hua Feng, 1,864 m), *Bright Summit Peak* (Guang Ming Ding, 1,840 m), and *Celestial Peak* (Tian Du Feng, literally *Capital of Heaven Peak*, 1,829 m).^{[2][5]} The World Heritage Site covers a core area of 154 square kilometres and a buffer zone of 142 square kilometres.^[8] The mountains were formed in the Mesozoic, about 100 million years ago, when an ancient sea disappeared due to uplift.^[9] Later, in the Quaternary Period, the landscape was shaped by the influence of glaciers.^[9]

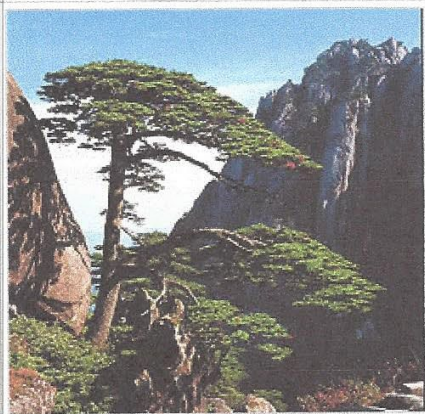
The vegetation of the area varies with elevation. Mesic forests cover the landscape below 1,100 meters. Deciduous forest stretches from 1,100 meters up to the tree line at 1,800 meters. Above that point, the vegetation consists of alpine grasslands. The area has diverse flora, where one-third of China's bryophyte families and more than half of its fern families are represented. The Huangshan pine (*Pinus hwangshanensis*) is named after Huangshan and is considered an example of vigor because the trees thrive by growing straight out of the rocks.^[9] Many of the area's pine trees are more than a hundred years old and have been given their own names (such as the *Ying Ke Pine*, or *Welcoming-Guests Pine*, which is thought to be over 1500 years old).^[5] The pines vary greatly in shape and size, with the most crooked of the trees being considered the most attractive.^[6] Furthermore, Huangshan's moist climate facilitates the growing of tea leaves,^[10] and the mountain has been called "one of China's premier green tea-growing mountains."^[11] *Mao feng cha* ("Fur Peak Tea"), a well-known local variety of green tea,^[12] takes its name from the downy tips of tea leaves found in the Huangshan area.^[13]

The mountaintops often offer views of the clouds from above, known as the *Sea of Clouds* (Chinese: 云海; pinyin: *yúnhǎi*)^[10] or "Huangshan Sea"^[6] because of the cloud's resemblance to an ocean, and many vistas are known by names such as "North Sea" or "South Sea."^[6] One writer remarked on the view of the clouds from Huangshan as follows:

To enjoy the magnificence of a mountain, you have to look upwards in most cases. To enjoy Mount Huangshan, however, you've got to look downward.^[6]

The area is also host to notable light effects, such as the renowned sunrises. Watching the sunrise is considered a "mandatory" part of visiting the area.^[3] A phenomenon known as *Buddha's Light* (Chinese: 佛光; pinyin: *fóguāng*)^[14] is also well-known and, on average, Buddha's Light only appears a couple of times per month.^[15] In addition, Huangshan has multiple hot springs, most of them located at the foot of the *Purple Cloud Peak*. The water stays at 42 °C all year^[16] and has a high concentration of carbonates, and is said to help prevent skin, joint, and nerve illness.^[9]

Huangshan was formed approximately 100 million years ago and gained its unique rock formations in the Quaternary Glaciation.^[9]

During the Qin Dynasty, Huangshan was known as *Yishan* (Mount Yi). In 747 AD, its name was changed to Huangshan (Mount Huang) by imperial decree;^[17] the name is commonly thought to have been coined in honor of Huang Di (the Yellow Emperor), a legendary Chinese emperor and the mythological ancestor of the Han Chinese.^[18] One legend states that Huangshan was the location from which the Yellow Emperor ascended to Heaven.^[5] Another legend states that the Yellow Emperor "cultivated moral character and refined Pills of Immortality in the mountains, and in so doing gave the mountains his name."^[9] The first use of this name "Huangshan" is often attributed to Chinese poet Li Bai.^[18] Huangshan was fairly inaccessible and little-known in ancient times, but its change of name in 747 AD seems to have brought the area more attention; from then on, the area was visited frequently and many temples were built there.^[17]

Huangshan is known for its stone steps,^[5] carved into the side of the mountain, of which there may be more than 60,000 throughout the area.^{[3][19][20]} The date at which work on the steps began is unknown, but they have been said to be over 1,500 years old.^[19]

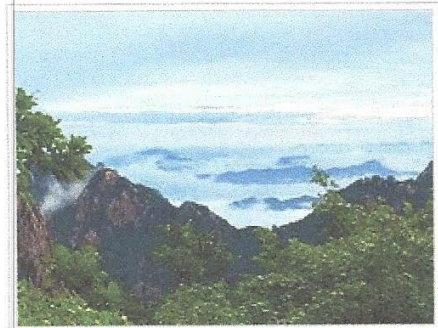
Over the years, many scenic spots and physical features on the mountain have been named;^[6] many of the names have narratives behind them. For example, one legend tells of a man who did not believe the tales of Huangshan's beauty and went to the mountains to see for himself; he was almost immediately convinced. One of the peaks he supposedly visited was named *Shixin* (始信), roughly meaning "start to believe."^[6]

In 1982, Huangshan was declared a "site of scenic beauty and historic interest" by the State Council of the People's Republic of China.^[17] It was named a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1990 for its scenery and for its role as a habitat for rare and threatened species.^[4]

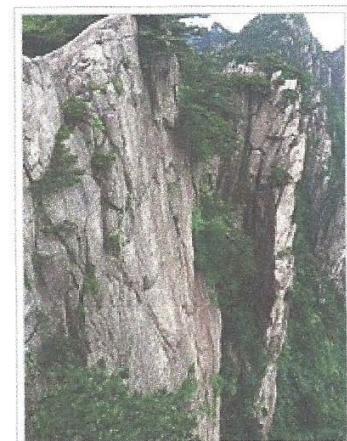
In 2002, Huangshan was named the "sister mountain" of Jungfrau in the Swiss Alps.^[5]

Artistic and scientific inspirations

Much of Huangshan's reputation derives from its significance in Chinese art and literature.^[21] In addition to inspiring poets such as Li Bai,^{[3][8]} Huangshan and the scenery therein has been the frequent subject of poetry and artwork, especially Chinese ink painting^[17] and, more recently, photography.^[2] Overall, from the Tang Dynasty to the end of the Qing Dynasty, over 20,000 poems were written about Huangshan, and a

... of painting named after it.^{[5][6]} The mountains have also appeared in modern works. James Cameron, director of the 2009 film *Avatar*, cited Huangshan as one of his influences in designing the fictional world of that film.^[22]

The area has also been a location for scientific research because of its diversity of flora and wildlife. In the early part of the 20th century, the geology and vegetation of Huangshan were the subject of multiple studies by both Chinese and foreign scientists.^[17] The mountain is still a subject of research. For example, in the late 20th century a team of researchers used the area for a field study of Tibetan Macaques, a local species of monkey.^[23]

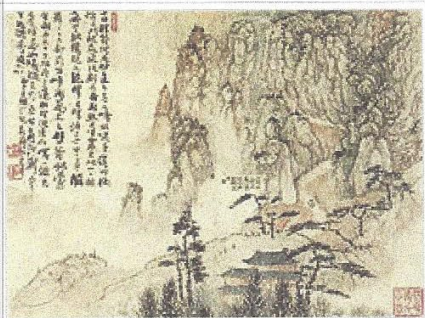
Tourism

Having at least 140 sections open to visitors,^[4] Huangshan is a major tourist destination in China.^{[2][3]} The city changed its name to Huangshan in 1987 in order to promote Huangshan tourism.^[24] In 2007, for instance, over 1.5 million tourists visited the mountain.^[25] The foot of the mountains is linked by rail and by air to Shanghai,^[2] and is also accessible from cities such as Hangzhou and Wuhu.^[26] As of 1990, there were over 50 kilometers of footpaths providing access to scenic areas for visitors and staffers of the facilities.^[17] Today there are also cable cars that tourists can use to ride directly from the base to one of the summits.^[2] Throughout the area there are hotels and guest houses that accommodate overnight visitors,^{[2][17]} many of whom hike up the mountains, spend the night at one of the peaks to view the sunrise, and then descend by a different route the next day.^[3] The area is classified as a AAAAAA scenic area by the China National Tourism Administration.^[27]

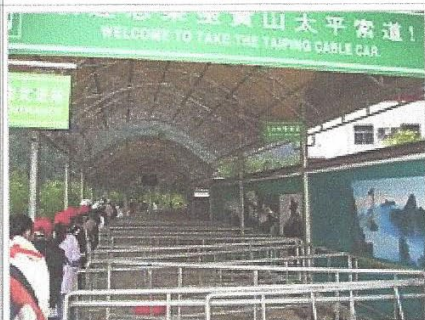
The hotels, restaurants, and other facilities at the top of the mountain are serviced and kept stocked by porters who carry resources up the mountain on foot, hanging their cargo from long poles balanced over their shoulders or backs.^[28]

Climate

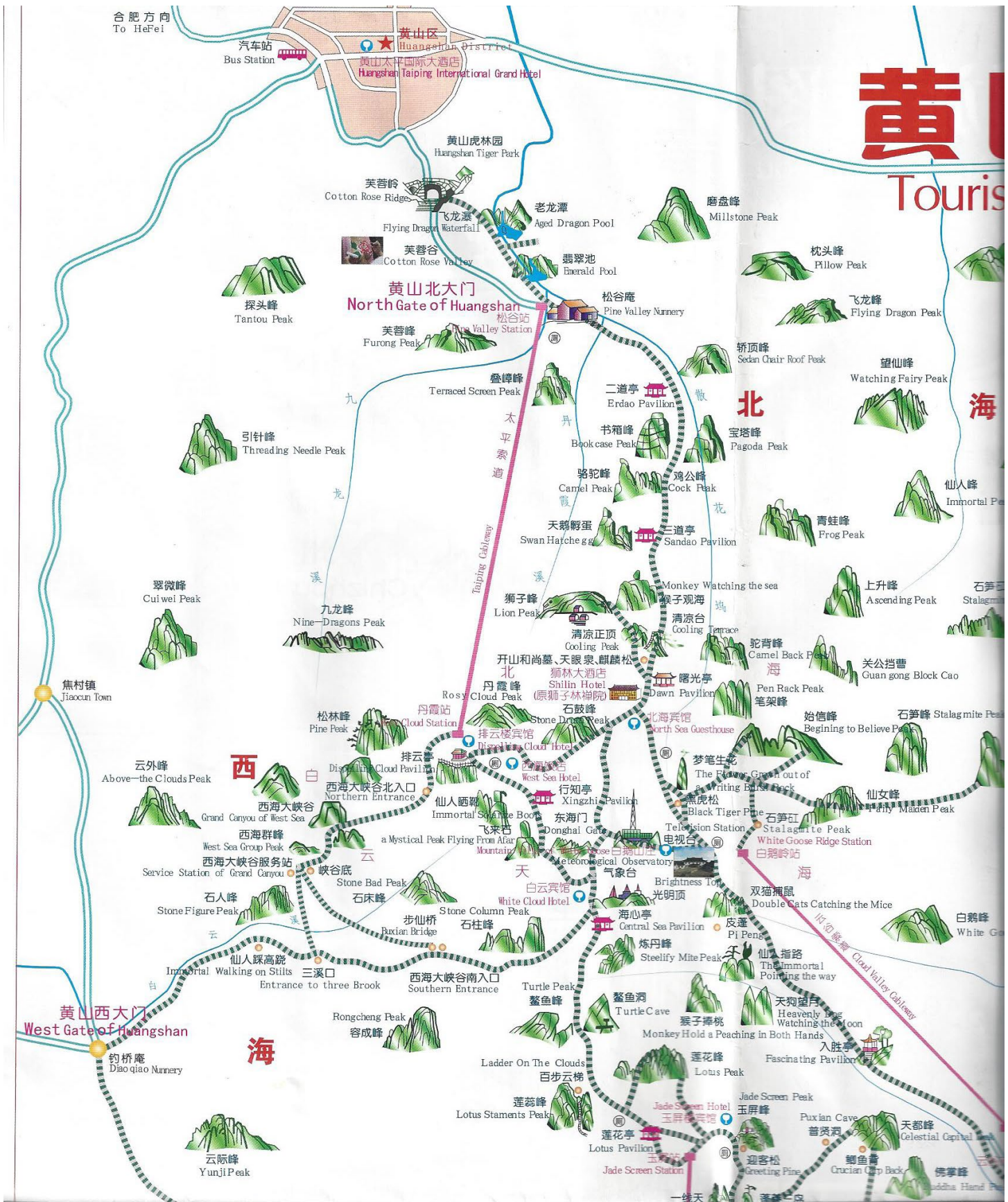
Huangshan has an oceanic climate (Cfb) according to the Köppen climate classification. Its elevation makes it colder and wetter than the rest of Anhui.

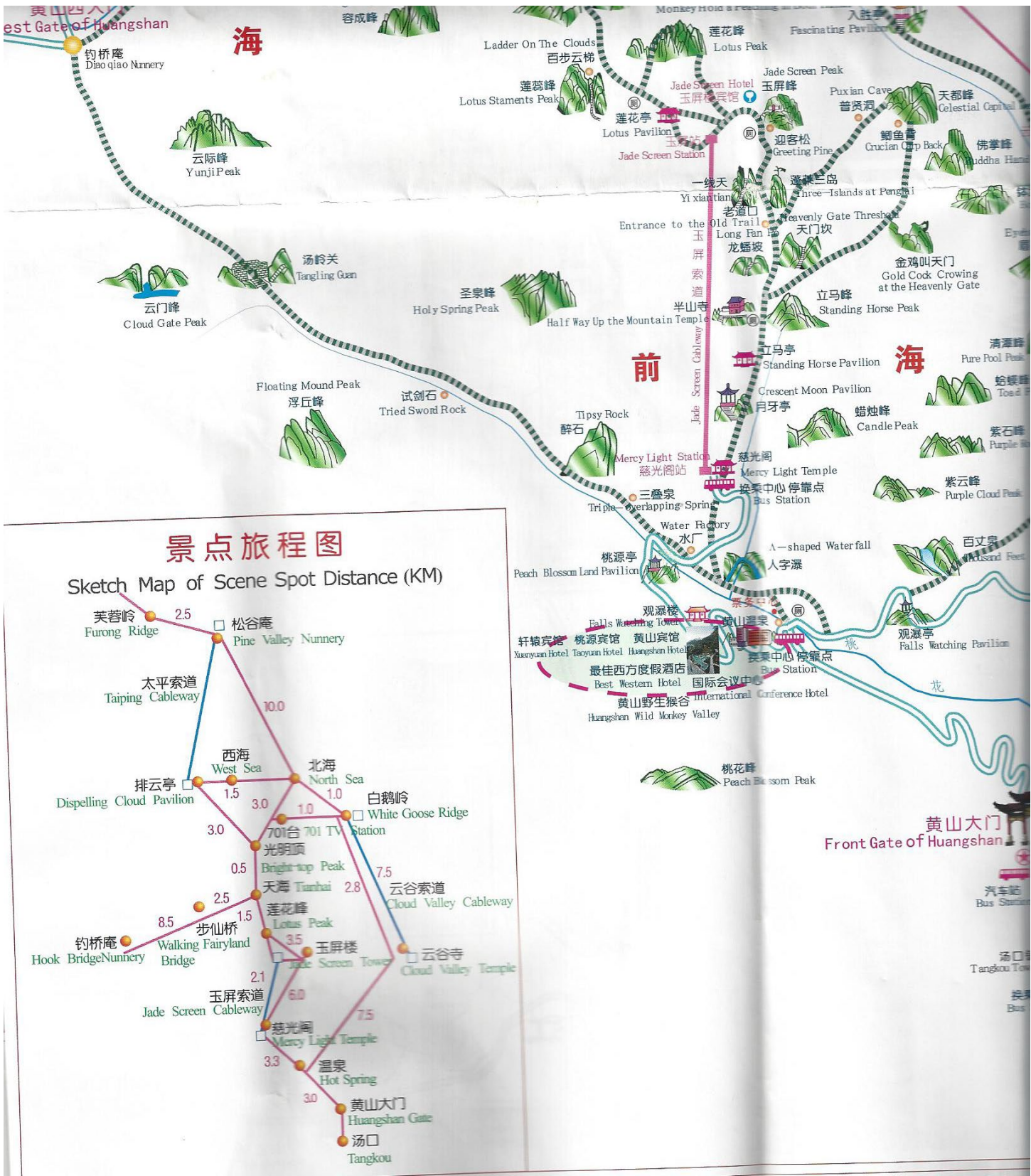


An ink painting depicting Huangshan by Shitao, 1670.

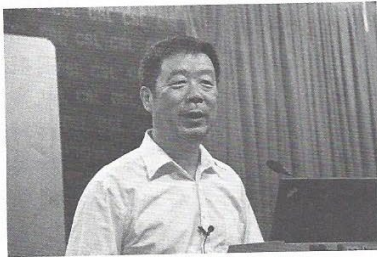

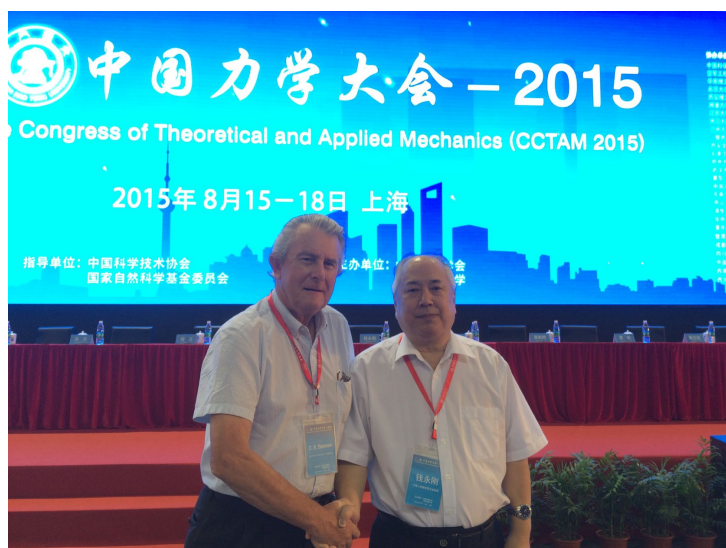


周建平, 中国载人航天工程总设计师、中国工程院院士、中国科协第八届全国委员会常务委员, 中国力学学会理事. 曾任国防科技大学教授、酒泉卫星发射中心总工程师、中国载人航天工程副总设计师. 曾获国家科技进步特等奖2项、一等奖1项, 获何梁何利基金奖、全国十佳科技工作者、国家杰出青年科学基金、优秀青年教师基金、光华科技基金奖, 多次获省部级科技进步一、二等奖, 享受政府特殊津贴.

航空航天技术的发展与力学有着比其他行业更加密切、天然的联系. 航天的三大支撑技术 - 结构、动力和控制都以力学作为其理论分析和设计的基础, 航天技术发展的需求也极大推动了力学相关学科的发展, 二者的相互促进在不断深入. 与无人航天飞行比较, 载人航天要求更高的可靠性和安全性, 同时由于载人航天器的规模巨大和功能更为复杂, 带来了复杂大系统的结构、机构、噪声、微重力和控制等一系列新的挑战.

对我国载人航天研发过程中面临的一些典型力学问题进行了概述, 内容涉及材料与结构、载荷与环境、动力学与控制、计算力学与结构优化、空间结构与控制、空气动力学与热防护、轨道动力学与控制等内容. 结合一些典型案例, 回顾了力学在载人航天发展过程起到的重大作用, 并力图根据工程研发的实际需要, 提出一些需要力学科学家解决的问题, 促进航天技术与力学的交叉融合, 为我国载人航天的更好发展奠定基础.

IMPORTANT BUILDINGS AND PLACES



Hippodrome (203) E5

It was commissioned by Septimius Severus (just like Circus Maximus in Rome) for chariot races. It was enlarged by Constantine I in 325. The U-shaped racetrack was about 450 m long and 130 m wide. Its stands were capable of holding 100,000 spectators with 40 steps. The actual track is some 5 m below the present surface. The surviving monuments of the Spina (the middle barrier of the racecourse), the two obelisks and the Serpentine Column, now sit in holes in a landscaped garden.

Galata Tower (1384) C5

The tower was built on the highest point of city walls, in the time of Genoese colony in 1384. In 16th c. it was used as dungeon for the Kasımpaşa fleet captives. In Selim II era the tower had been used for an observatory. Until 1964 it's been used as fire tower. In 1967 the tower remained closed for the restoration. Having been restored in 1967 the tower was once again opened to the public. During the restoration the modifications of Ottoman era have been reevaluated and the authentic Genoese touch has been reconstructed. Hezarfen Ahmed Çelebi flew using artificial wings for gliding from this tower over the Bosphorus.

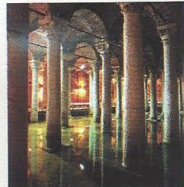


Maiden's Tower (Kız Kulesi) (B.C.410) D7

The architectural process goes back to 341 BC. In 410 BC the iron chains were stretched between Sarayburnu and the island, and then the tower became customs maritime station. During the conquest of Istanbul the tower has been used for defense purposes. With the addition of a beacon, the tower gets the guide function. After the fire of 1719, which had started by flames of beacon, the tower had been repaired and it has been slightly renovated. A glassed chalet and leaded dome have been built. The entire building has been masonry rebuilt. In 1920 the tower gets a new automatic lighting system. Until 1959 the building served as radar station. Nowadays the tower is being used as restaurant.

Basilica Cistern (527) E5

The cistern was built in 6th c. by Roman Emperor Justinian in order to provide water for the city. This cistern is an underground chamber of 143 m by 65 m. The ceiling, which covers 9,800 m², is being carried by 336 marble columns each 9 m high. The capitals of the columns are mainly Ionic and Corinthian styles, with the exception of a few Doric styles with no engravings.



The bases of two of the columns reuse earlier blocks carved with the head of a Medusa. They are located in the northwest corner of the cistern. The origin of the two heads is unknown, though it is rumored that the heads were brought to the cistern, in order to protect it from evil. According to legend she was one of three gorgons, a female monster; gazing upon her would turn onlookers to stone. The cracks and the columns were repaired in 1968. Having been restored in 1985 by the Istanbul Metropolitan Municipality, the cistern was once again opened to the public in 1987.

Hagia Sophia (Ayasofya, 360-532) E5



Hagia Sophia is one of the magnificent masterpieces of world architectural history. It was originally built as a church. The construction began during the reign of the Byzantine Emperor Constantine I. This structure with the basilica plan and a wooden roof was burned down due to a riot and no remains survived. A second church was ordered by Theodosius II and was inaugurated in 415. However the second church was also burned down to the ground during Nika Revolt in 532. Emperor Justinian I (527-565) took a decision to build a larger church than the first two Hagia Sophias and commissioned the third and current Hagia Sophia to Isidore of Miletus and Anthemius of Tralles. From an architectural viewpoint, it is made up of a vast interior, two naves, an apse, interior and exterior narthexes. The interior area has the measures of 100 x 70 m. It is covered with a dome that has a diameter of 30.31 m and 55 m of height. Fatih Mosque and Kulliyah (1470) D3

The Complex was commissioned by Mehmed II, the Conqueror and it was constructed by the architect Sinaüddin Yusuf bin Abdullah. The original mosque at the center of the complex no longer stands today. In the earthquake of 1766, the main dome collapsed and the walls were irreparably damaged. Sultan Mustafa III had a new and completely different mosque built. The mosque was rebuilt by the architect, Mehmed Tahir Ağa between 1767-1771. Three walls of şadırvan (water-tank with a fountain), şadırvan, corona door, a part of the minarets and a small part of outer walls remained from the original mosque today. The colonnade of şadırvan courtyard, which is parallel to kiblah wall, is higher than three other directions. The outer frames of domes are octagonal and placed on arches. Sultan Ahmed Mosque and Kulliyah (Blue Mosque, 1617) E5

This mosque is the only mosque that was originally built with six minarets. As its walls are adorned with world famous Iznik tiles, it is known as the "Blue Mosque" all over the world.

Its architect was Sedefkar Mehmet Ağa. Its minber (or pulpit) is decorated with mother of pearl while its interior walls and columns up to the second storey windows are sheathed with the richest tiles in various types. Two minarets, each with two balconies and four minarets found on the corners of the mosque each having three balconies, are 60 m high. The 260 windows flood with light the interior space, which is covered by a dome 33,6 m in diameter and 43 m high. The high position of courtyard dominates the other buildings.



Süleymaniye Mosque and Kulliyah (1556) D4



It was commissioned by Süleiman the Magnificent and designed by Architect Sinan on the third hill of Istanbul which looks onto Golden Horn. It was Sinan's master-builder period work and his attempting to overcome Hagia Sophia. This colossal imperial mosque has colored window glasses decorated with flower embroideries, the mihrab (niche) and minber (pulpit) ornamented with marble engravings and its marble inner walls adorned with tiles and inscriptions.

Each two minarets have two balconies while the other two minarets have three balconies. The dome has a diameter of 27.25 m and is 53 m high when measured from the base. The dimensions of the dome are 63x69 m. With these measures; Süleymaniye Mosque is one of the most beautiful monuments of the world. There is simplicity in the interior of the mosque. The most striking interior point is the stained glasses decorated with 16th century Turkish motives on the mihrab wall.

Eyüp Sultan Mosque and Kulliyah (1459) A2

The mosque was commissioned by Mehmed II, the Conqueror. After the collapse of the previous one due to the earthquake of 1766, this is the grand Baroque style mosque which was commissioned by the Ottoman Sultan Selim III and built by architect Uzun Hüseyin Ağa in 1800. It has 2 minarets – each having 2 balconies – and a dome with a diameter of 17,50 meters. The walls of the mosque are adorned with inscriptions and tiles; the inner dome is decorated with colored embroidery and hand-drawn motives. The sultans succeeding Mehmed II, the Conqueror completed their coronation and sword-bearing ceremonies with a visit to the Eyup Sultan Mausoleum. It is also known as the Great Mosque. There are 18 Mausoleums in its garden. The Mosque is a masterpiece of architect Uzun Hüseyin Ağa. It was named after the mausoleum of Eyüp Sultan (died in 627).



Pierre Loti: It is hill in the district of Eyüp overlooking the Golden Horn. It is named after Julien Viaud, a French author and orientalist, who visited Istanbul in 1876 and settled in the city, known to be visiting the coffeehouse on the hill very often. The hill and the cafe are frequently visited by tourists coming to Istanbul.



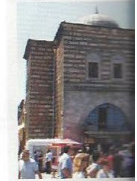



Topkapi Palace


Topkapi Palace was constructed by Fatih Sultan Mehmet (Mehmet the Conqueror) in 1478. It has been used as the administrative center of the Ottoman Empire and the residence of the Sultans for 380 years. Even though the Household of the Palace began to live in Dolmabahçe, Yıldız and other palaces in nineteenth century, Topkapi Palaces never lost its significance.

In the period of Sultan Abdülmecid, the goods in the treasury of Topkapi Palace are exhibited to then English ambassador thus begins the tradition of exhibiting the historical artifacts of the Treasury of Topkapi Palace for foreigner. In the times of Sultan Abdülaziz the glass cases were made and artifacts were exhibited to foreigners within glass cases.

By the order of Mustafa Kemal Atatürk, some small repairs were made in 1924. By taking the required administrative measures for the tours, it was opened as museum in October 9, 1924. The sections which are opened for visits are Kubbetü'l (Under Dome), Mecidiye Kiosk, Head of Physician's Room, Mustafa Paşa Kiosk and Bagdat Kiosk.

Harem which stands for "a place forbidden" by its lexical meaning has been used for family concept in the Islamic society. Harem is the name of private and forbidden place of the dynasty. Harem where Sultans lived with their families is a complex comprising of the architectural styles of various periods from the 16th century till the beginning of the 19th century.

There are 300 rooms, 9 Turkish baths, 2 mosques and 1 hospital in the Harem. It was badly damaged in the fire which broke out in 1865. Present Harem has been reshaped by renovation after this fire and extensions were added in time.

CESME, TURKEY

Just a stone's throw from Greece lies Cesme, at the northern edge of the evocatively named Turquoise Coast. Pristine beaches, thermal springs, and a perfect climate have made Cesme a popular resort for more than a century, and the beaches are truly alluring, with a surprising variety of sand textures. Cesme means "fountain" in Persian, but it's unclear if the namers were referencing the many thermal springs or the numerous Ottoman fountains scattered around its streets.

Explore the 14th-century Genoese castle whose walls dominate the town center, and enjoy a taste of mastic-flavored gum, taffy, rice pudding or coffee compliments of the legendary terebinth tree.

Its sap is said to be a panacea for all ills, although in a place this delightful you may have trouble coming up with an ill to treat.

WINDSTAR RECOMMENDS

Ilica:

Ilica is a large resort area 5 km east of Çeşme to which it is attached administratively, although it bears aspects of a township apart in many of its characteristics. It is famed for its thermal springs, which is the very meaning of its name.

Ilica started out as a distinct settlement towards the end of the 19th century, initially as a retreat for wealthy people, especially from Izmir and during summer holidays. Today, it is a popular destination for many. Mentioned by Pausanias and Charles Texier, Ilica thermal springs, which extend well into the sea, are also notable in Turkey for having been the subject of the first scientifically based analysis in Turkish language of a thermal spring, published in 1909 by Yusuf Cemal. By his time the thermal springs were well-known both internationally, scientific and journalistic literature having been published in French and in Greek, and across Ottoman lands, since the construction here of a still-standing yali associated with Muhammad Ali of Egypt's son Tosun Pasha who had sought a cure in Ilica before his premature death.[10]

Ilica has a fine beach of its own, about 1.5 km long, as well as favorable wind conditions which make it a prized location for windsurfing.

Kusadasi offers many historic sites including the Virgin Mary House, but it is Ephesus that steals the show. Once an important trading stop along the Silk Road, its well-preserved ruins reflect what was one of the most beautiful and advanced cities of the ancient world. Walk the marble-lined streets past the huge theater where St. Paul once preached, the gladiator's graveyard, the incomparable facade of the Celsus Library. If you were wealthy, you might have lived in one of the grand terrace houses, their ornate frescoes and mosaics still shining. You would have shopped at the agora, worked out at the gymnasium, and bathed in the public baths. Life was good. But they didn't have a graceful private yacht waiting for them in the harbor!

WINDSTAR RECOMMENDS

Ancient Ephesus (Efes):

This site is one of the grandest and best preserved of all the ancient classical ruins. The prosperity Ephesus enjoyed as a port of trade connecting Europe, Asia and Africa was dependent on it having a functional harbor. Ephesus began to decline when its harbor was ruined by centuries of silt accumulation that occurred at the mouth of the Kaystros River. Today the city lays 6 miles from the sea. The region lay dormant from 1450 - 1950. At its height, Ephesus was the most important commercial center in this part of the world and had a population of more than a quarter of a million people. Inscriptions found by archaeologists described Ephesus as the "first and greatest metropolis of Asia." British and Austrian archaeologists excavated the site in the 19th century. The Austrians smuggled out most of the relics found there, but returned them when the Ottoman government threatened to ban all future Austrian excavations

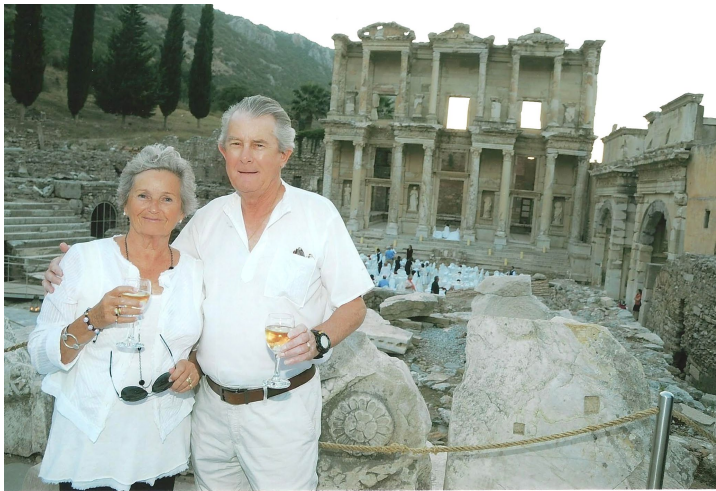

KALYMNOS, GREECE

Kalymnos, is a Greek island and municipality in the southeastern Aegean Sea. It belongs to the Dodecanese and is located to the west of the peninsula of Bodrum (the ancient Halicarnassos), between the islands of Kos (south, at a distance of 12 km (7 mi) and Leros (north, at a distance of less than 2 km (1 mi): the latter is linked to it through a series of islets. Kalymnos lies between two to five hours away by sea from Rhodes. The island is known as Càlino in Italian and Kilimli or Kelemez in Turkish.

In 2011 the island had a population of 16,001, making it the third most populous island of the Dodecanese, after Kos and Rhodes. It is known in Greece for the affluence of much of its population, and also stands as both the wealthiest member of the Dodecanese and one of the wealthiest Greek islands overall. The Municipality of Kalymnos, which includes the populated offshore islands of Pserimos (pop. 80), Telendos (94), Kalolimnos (2), and Pláti (2), as well as several uninhabited islets, has a combined land area of 134.544 square kilometres (51.948 sq mi) and a total population of 16,179 inhabitants.

WINDSTAR RECOMMENDS

Sponge Diving

Kalymnos is known and billed as the "Sponge-divers' island." Sponge diving has long been a common occupation on Kalymnos and sponges were the main source of income of the Kalymnians, bringing wealth to the island and making it famous throughout the Mediterranean. The Kalymnians harvested sponges from the sea-bed as close as Pserimos or as far as North Africa. Early diving was done without equipment (free diving), using a harpoon. Sponges are still fished individually, by hand.

The Greek sponge trade was centered close in the Dodecanese, featuring Kalymnos until mid-80s, when a disease hit the eastern Mediterranean destroying a great number of sponges and damaging the sponge-fishing industry as a result. Today, Kalymnos faces a lack of sponges due to the outbreak of a disease which has decimated sponge crops.

An annual celebration, Sponge Week, occurs a week after Easter to honour this "Kalymnian gold." Much has been written, sung and filmed about the legendary courage and recklessness of the sponge divers themselves.

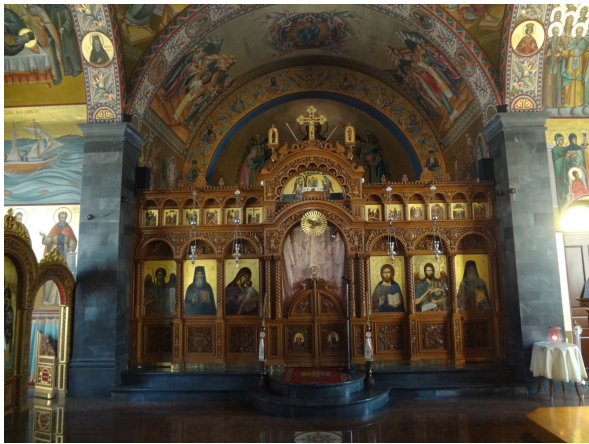

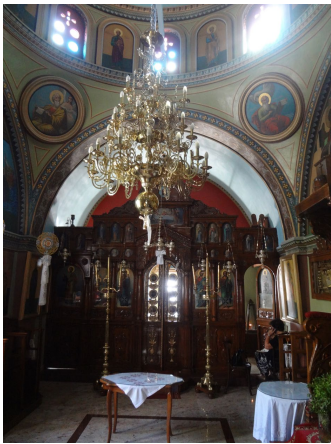

RHODES, GREECE

Even without the ancient Colossus standing guard over the harbor, it's an impressive sight. Gazing up at the city walls rising from sheer cliffs, you can imagine the despair the various forces must have felt over the eons as they repeatedly (and often fruitlessly) laid siege. You, however, are greeted warmly upon arrival and welcomed into the cobbled old town, one of the best-preserved medieval cities in Europe.

There are no cars here, just passageways designed for knights in shining armor, medieval inns that once housed them, and museums that tell of the many civilizations that collided here at the meeting point of three continents. Walk beyond the walls to the "new" city with its elegant Venetian buildings, stroll Rodini Park where Julius Caesar, Brutus, and Marc Anthony studied rhetoric, or head to Elli beach for sun and golden sand.

WINDSTAR RECOMMENDS

The Fortifications of Rhodes

The fortifications of the town of Rhodes are shaped like a defensive crescent around the medieval town and consist mostly in a modern fortification composed of a huge wall made of an embankment encased in stone, equipped with scarp, bastions, moat, counterscarp and glacis. The portion of fortifications facing the harbour is instead composed of a crenellated wall. On the moles towers and defensive forts are found.

They were built by the Knights Hospitaller of Saint John by enhancing the existing Byzantine walls starting from 1309, the year in which they took possession of the island after a three-year struggle.

Like most of the defensive walls they were built with a technique called rubble masonry which allows for a great mass capable of withstanding the gunshots with smooth external stone faces to avoid climbing.

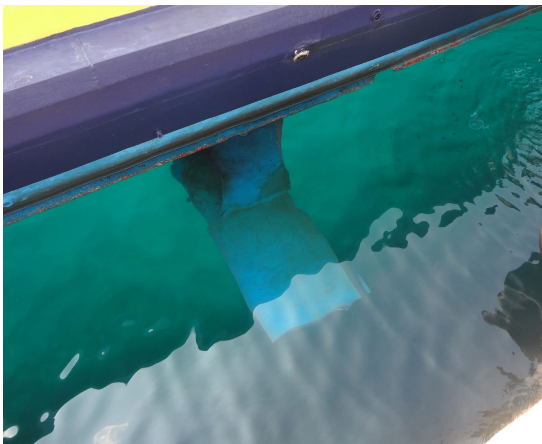

A little town of whitewashed houses located on the northern tip of the island, was the economic and commercial center of Santorini until World War II. Almost completely devastated in 1956 A.D. by an earthquake; the town was rebuilt to its former self in the old way, filled with winding streets and narrow alleyways. There are some wonderful small galleries of modern art, folk art and traditional handicrafts. People usually seek out the village of Oia to escape the crowds of Fira

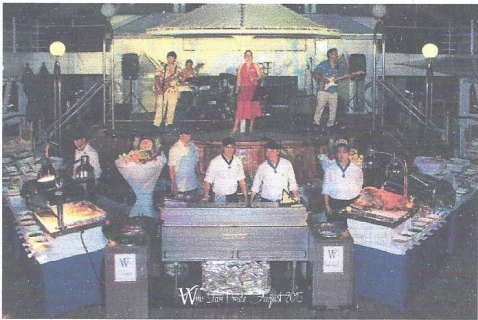

MUSEUM OF PREHISTORIC THIRA (FIRA, tel.: 22860 23217)

Here you will find an exhibition of findings from various excavations which reveal the island's history from the Neolithic to the Bronze Age. You will have the chance to see elements from the city architecture of Akrotiri as well as, many weapons, household equipment, unique gold leaf figurine and weapons. HERAKLION, GREECE

Heraklion is the largest city and the administrative capital of the island of Crete, Greece. It is one of the largest cities in Greece. According to the results of 2011 census, the population of the city was 173,993 inhabitants while the Heraklion urban area has a population of 225,574 and it extends over an area of 684.3 km² (264.2 sq mi).

The present city of Heraklion was founded in 824 by the Saracens who had been expelled from Al-Andalus by Emir Al-Hakam I and had taken over the island from the Eastern Roman Empire. They built a moat around the city for protection, and named the city rabd al-handaq ("Castle of the Moat"). The Saracens allowed the port to be used as a safe haven for pirates who operated against Imperial shipping and raided Imperial territory around the Aegean.

In 1898, the autonomous Cretan State was created, under Ottoman suzerainty, with Prince George of Greece as its High Commissioner and under international supervision. During the period of direct occupation of the island by the Great Powers (1898–1908), Candia was part of the British zone. At this time, the city was renamed "Heraklion", after the Roman port of Heracleum ("Heraclides' city"), whose exact location is unknown.

In 1913, with the rest of Crete, Heraklion was incorporated into the Kingdom of Greece.

WINDSTAR RECOMMENDS

Knossos

Knossos is the site of the most important and best known Minoan palace complex in Crete. It is located 3 miles south of Heraklion. According to tradition, Knossos was the seat of the legendary Cretan king Minos. The Palace is also connected with further legends, such as the myth of the Labryinth and the Minotaur, as well as the story of Daidalos and Ikaros. Excavation has revealed that the site was continuously inhabited from the Neolithic period (7000 – 3000 B.C.) until Roman times.

Venetian Wall

The core of the city is still enclosed and defined by the Venetian wall, which includes seven out jutting bastions. In the southernmost of these, the Martinengo Bastion, is the grave of Niko Kazantzakis, standing on a windswept hilltop with its moving inscription, "I hope for nothing. I fear nothing. I am free."

MONEMVASIA, GREECE

Monemvasia is a town and a municipality in Laconia, Greece. The town is located on a small island off the east coast of the Peloponnese. The island is linked to the mainland by a short causeway 200m in length. Its area consists mostly of a large plateau some 100 metres above sea level, up to 300 m wide and 1 km long, the site of a powerful medieval fortress. The town walls and many Byzantine churches remain from the medieval period. The seat of the municipality is the town Molaol. The town's name derives from two Greek words, mone and emvasia, meaning "single entrance". Its Italian form, Malvasia, gave its name to Malmsey wine. Monemvasia's nickname is the Gibraltar of the East or The Rock.

Fortress town of Monemvasia

Castles, walls, old mansions, narrow cobbled lanes, churches, low arches and vaults, coats of arms, imperial marble thrones, Byzantine icons all give the impression of a town untouched by time.

As one enters the main gate of the Lower Town, immediately above it to the left is the birthplace of the poet Yiannis Ritsos. The main thoroughfare, consisting of a narrow cobbled Byzantine street flanked by shops, leads to the main square dominated by an old cannon and the town cathedral, the Church of Elkomenos Christos. Directly opposite the church is a 16th century former mosque now housing the Monemvasia Archaeological Collection.

From the main square a number of picturesque narrow streets fan out over the Lower Town. One of these leads to the Upper Town or Goula, a steep climb taking about 15 minutes, but a rewarding one for the panoramic view of the Lower Town and the surrounding open sea glittering below.

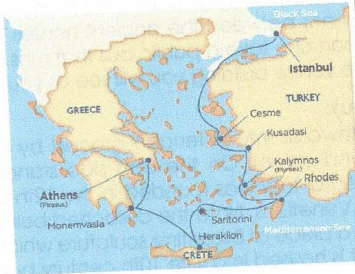

Overview

Monemvasia (pronounced Mo-nem-vah-SEE-ah) is a well-known medieval fortress with an adjacent town, located on a small peninsula off the coast of the Peloponnese in the Greek prefecture of Laconia. The peninsula is linked to the mainland by a short causeway 535 feet in length. The ruins include the defensive structures and many Byzantine churches. The name of the town derives from two Greek words, mone and emvassia, meaning "single entrance". Many of the streets are narrow and fit only for pedestrians. Monemvasia's nickname is the Gibraltar of the East or the Rock. The rock is 300m tall and 1.8 km long.

The upper town has been long abandoned. A path of hairpin bends passes the ruins of once-majestic buildings and leads to Aghia Sophia (Holy Wisdom), a beautifully intact mid-12th-century Byzantine church with a sculptured door and marble reliefs. The highest peak in the upper town, accessible by climbing a trail of lush brush, is about 656 feet above sea level.

History

Monemvasia was most likely settled by the residents of Sparta in the late sixth century after they fled barbarian invaders. They built homes and churches on the far side of the rock along spiraling lanes, erected giant walls along the lower city and around the fortress on the rock's peak and crossed to the mainland either through a wooden drawbridge or by wading through the shallow waters. By 1193, Monemvasia was a major city in the Peloponnese. Ships sailing between Constantinople (now Istanbul) and what is now Italy stopped there, giving rest to aristocrats and high-ranking church members and loading Greek exports like olive oil and wine headed for the West. Monemvasia passed through Byzantine, Vatican, Frank, Venetian and Ottoman hands before becoming part of modern Greece.

During its time as a Venetian possession, when it was known as Malvasia or Napoli di Malvasis, Monemvasia was an important trading port and port of call in the Levant. The town was protected by a fortified bridge, 535 feet long, carried on 13 arches which could be breached in time of danger. The castle on top of the rock was protected by a circuit wall which descended from the top of the hill and swung around along the seafront and up the hill again thus enclosing the town on three sides. In those days the population numbered 30,000 and was served by about 40 churches.

Tributes to...

Professor Terry Jones (1939 - 2015)

Professor Terence Valentine Jones was an inspirational leader, a compulsive innovator, an inventor of genius and a brilliant all-round teacher. He had boundless enthusiasm and a genuine warmth appreciated by all who knew him. He was acknowledged throughout the world as one of the legends of high speed flow and heat transfer.

Terry graduated as a physicist from Oxford. The rigor and scientific enquiry fundamental to this subject stood him well throughout his career. He joined the Department of Engineering Science at Oxford as a doctoral research student. In 1968 he and his DPhil supervisor, Don Schultz, realised that the short duration wind tunnels and innovative heat transfer instrumentation used to study hypersonic flow could be profitably applied to gas turbine heat transfer and aerodynamics. They convinced Rolls Royce that Oxford had much to offer and started a partnership with the company which prospers to this day. Terry invented the first of many new wind tunnels, the Isentropic Light Piston Tunnel, or ILPT. He and Don encouraged the University to buy the old Oxford Power Station which became the first Osney Laboratory.

The Osney Turbomachinery Group prospered and in 1975 they built a large ILPT, to Terry's design, to test turbine cascades. This became the Oxford Rotor and is still in use. This was so successful that the National Gas Turbine Establishment (later to become QinetiQ) commissioned the research group to build a larger ILPT. This operated on the Pyestock and Farnborough sites for about twenty years. Recently, when QinetiQ closed down their turbomachinery research, Rolls Royce financed the tunnel's return to Oxford, where it continues as the Oxford Turbine Research and is testimony to Terry's innovative skills.

After Don Schultz died in 1987, it was appropriate that Terry should take over the leadership of the Osney group. In 1988 Terry was elected as the first Donald Schultz Professor of Turbomachinery. He moved from St Anne's college to a Professorial fellowship at St Catherine's. He continued to expand the group adding more facilities and researchers.

Terry was the first to see that thermochromic liquid crystals could be used to measure heat transfer and this flowered into new techniques, now in use world-wide. As well as turbomachinery, Terry worked on innovative measurement techniques, industrial air coolers and cooling towers, molecular beams, shock waves and hypersonics. He published over 200 academic papers. He supervised 50 research students, instilling his rigorous methods and sense of discovery.

Terry was a gentleman, in every sense of the word. He shared his ideas generously, and always gave his time freely to all who sat with him in his "power station superintendent's office". Of course, this also meant that his meetings often finished late, as he continuously enthused over new concepts and ideas.

His fundamental approach to research problems won him great respect and affection from all who worked with him. His considerable achievements were recognised in the wider world. He led a team which was awarded the 1996 Royal Society Energy award, complete with Gold Medals! He was a Fellow of the Royal Aeronautical Society, a Fellow of the Royal Academy of Engineering and an Associate Fellow of the AIAA. In 2011, he was awarded the prestigious Silver Medal by the Royal Aeronautical Society for his lifetime contributions to aerospace. And as recently as 2014 he was awarded a lifetime achievement award by the Mathematical, Physical & Life Sciences Division at Oxford.

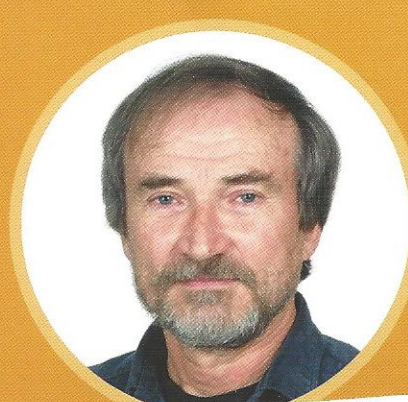
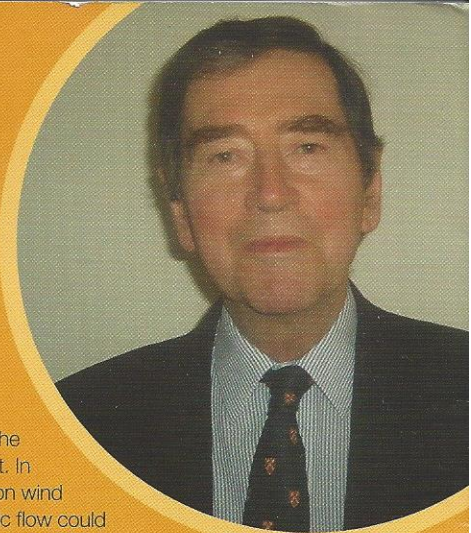

Ethnicity estimate for Christopher Brennen

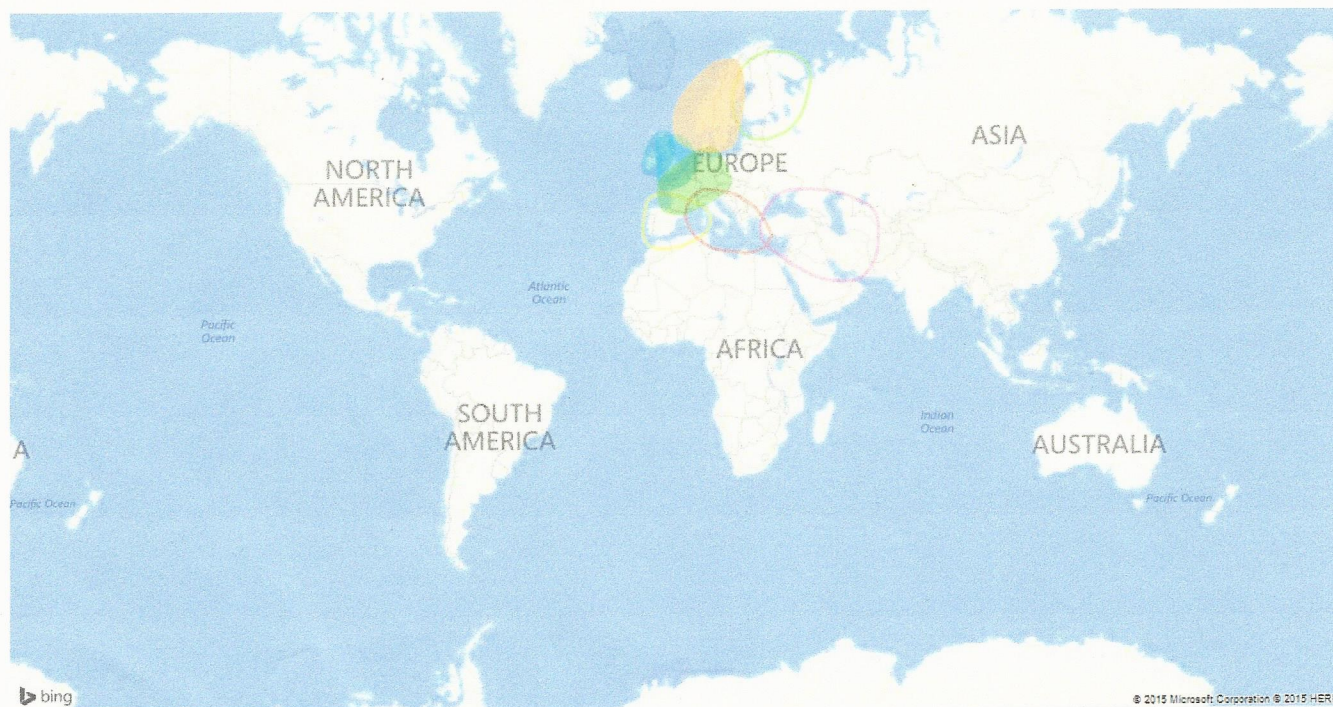


Ethnicity estimate for Danamichele Brennen
