

Collect your luggage from the conveyor belt and walk out to the arrival concourse. Someone shall be waiting for you holding a folder written 'TRAVEL CONNECTIONS'.

Drive from the airport to Nairobi Serena Hotel and check in. Rest of the day at leisure.

The Nairobi Serena is a beautiful garden hotel. The hotel's clean white silhouette rises at the edge of Nairobi's extensive Central Park. A delicate blink of Morula's long lashes reveals her sensitive yet powerful personality. Jabu takes you, trunk in hand, with his bold and generous nature and together you slowly uncover the age-old secrets of the African elephant and the mysteries of the surrounding wilderness. Thembi, is a common Zulu name meaning trust. Thembi is the sweetheart of the herd and the smallest in stature. Perfectly formed, pretty and dainty, Thembi knows a few tricks for getting her way. Smart and very social, she loves to be the centre of attention.

Morula, is named after a beautiful African fruit tree. Her strongest personality trait is one of great gentleness; she is mild-natured, sensitive and easily bruised emotionally. She can be described as a wallflower but she blossoms beautifully when love and attention are focused directly on her. Morula weaves a powerful magic of her own as in her quiet and subtle way she captures your heart with her sincere, loyal and sweet nature.

### By road

Chicheley Hall is situated about 7 miles from Milton Keynes, just 10 minutes from Junction 14 of the M1.

Directions from the M25: Proceed north along the M1 until junction 14. At the exit roundabout, join the A509 towards Wellingborough and Kettering. Turn right at the next roundabout, still following the A509. Pass over next roundabout onto a long, straight mile of dual carriageway. At the top of the hill, turn right at Chicheley Hill roundabout onto the A422 towards Bedford. After approximately 400 m, take the first right into Chicheley Road (signposted North Crawley), follow the road for approximately a quarter of a mile then turn left through the gates to Chicheley Hall

Please note that some satellite navigation systems incorrectly advise use of Hall Lane. The correct access is via the main entrance on Chicheley Road.

Follow the gravel driveway around the side of the buildings. Parking is available either on the cobbled courtyard at the side of the main house, or if this is full, please follow the gravel drive past the house (keeping the buildings on your right) and park in the green overflow carpark just beyond the buildings.

# By taxi

Taxis can be pre-booked for railway station or airport pickup with Eezycabs.

Ask to be dropped at the side entrance of the main house (white doorway, signposted Visitors Reception) if arriving in the evening to check-in. If arriving in the morning for a meeting in the Wolfson Centre, ask to be dropped at the glass atrium.

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

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

Morula, is named after a beautiful African fruit tree. Her strongest personality trait is one of great gentleness; she is mild-natured, sensitive and easily bruised emotionally. She can be described as a wallflower but she blossoms beautifully when love and attention are focused directly on her. Morula weaves a powerful magic of her own as in her quiet and subtle way she captures your heart with her sincere, loyal and sweet nature.


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rains), you might find yourself walking on some pretty steep slopes for several hours. On the other hand, you could reach your group after a 30-minute stroll. It's best to prepare for the most active option however, and if nothing else, a few hill walks before you leave would be beneficial.

# The gorilla trekking experience in Volcanoes National Park

Whilst a gorilla trekking safari is likely to be a once-in-a-lifetime experience for you, the staff at Volcanoes National Park have been doing this for several years and run a very smooth operation, hence treks to the mountain gorillas are well-organised and clearly structured.

### What it's like on a gorilla trekking safari

On the day of your gorilla trekking, you'll set off very early in the morning to track to the apes from the edge of the forest. Your driver/guide will take you from your lodge (see places to stay in Volcanoes National Park) to the park headquarters in Kinigi village. The guides here speak excellent English and are very good. They will be taking you to a specific group of 'habituated' mountain gorillas, which they know well and are used to human visitors.

You'll be divided into parties of 8 and after a briefing on safety and gorilla trekking etiquette, you'll be driven to the start of the trail to reach your mountain gorilla group. Your guide will then lead you along generally clear paths up into the forest, in radio communication with the trackers that stay with the group so that they can be located. The altitude is over 2,500m, so although the pace is unhurried, the hike is tiring and can be steep in parts, taking from 30 minutes to a few hours. Don't be surprised if you feel a bit breathless at this altitude – this is perfectly normal.

Most trekkers are a little apprehensive – a large silverback male gorilla can weigh up to 200kg, or three times the weight of the average man, but the apprehension usually vanishes when you see the group. Often the gorillas will be spread around a small area of dense vegetation. They'll continue with their feeding and interactions, nonchalant about their visitors, though watching you with interest. Occasionally one, often a playful youngster, will approach you with curiosity – sometimes coming so close that you'll have to move away.

### Gorilla tracking etiquette

Mountain gorillas share 98% of our DNA and as such are very susceptible to catching human infections, particularly respiratory ones, but they don't have our immune system to deal with them – a common cold could eventually prove life-threatening. Various rules for gorilla trekking are therefore in place to help protect these precious primates. Only one group of tourists can visit the mountain gorillas each day and once you've found them, you'll have just one precious hour in their company. If you have a cold, flu or other contagious infection, you shouldn't go gorilla trekking.

You should keep a distance of 7m from the gorillas, although of course the gorillas themselves are unaware of this and will often get very close, in which case you should try to move away.

When you're with your group, you should try not to make sudden movements and to keep your voices low so that the group remains relaxed. Although these mountain gorillas are now used to seeing people, do bear in mind that they are still wild animals and can sometimes react unexpectedly, so always heed your guide's and trackers' instructions.

You won't be allowed to eat or drink when you're with the gorillas.

### What kit should you take for a gorilla trekking safari?

Paths on gorilla treks can be slippery, muddy and steep so sturdy walking boots are essential. Some people take thick gardening gloves because of the brambles and nettles en route and you should wear long trousers rather than shorts. A waterproof jacket may come in handy and take some water and a snack in case it's a long trek. You might also find a walking stick or pole helpful.

For a small fee, porters are available at the trailheads to carry your backpacks and offer a hand during tricky parts of the hike. Even if you don't really need them, hiring a porter is a helpful way to contribute directly to the local economy and chatting to them en route can enhance your experience both of local life and of your gorilla trek.

### Photography on a gorilla trekking safari

If you're a keen photographer, taking your own pictures of mountain gorillas is one of the most magical photo sessions you'll ever experience. Do bear in mind that the light can be poor in the rainforest and that use of flash is not permitted. You might also need to protect your camera against heavy rain.

## Mountain gorilla groups in Rwanda's Volcanoes National Park

The various groups and their locations will obviously change from time to time: mountain gorillas often climb higher in the dry season and descend during the rains, they might move on due to pressure from wild gorillas and individuals will often join other groups. When tracking gorillas, it's possible to request to visit a specific group once you are at the park headquarters, but this can never be guaranteed. Currently these are the ten groups habituated for gorilla safaris in Veterances National Park:

The Sabyinyo Group has about 12 individuals, including two silverback gorillas, and is usually found relatively close

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to the edge of the forest (about 20-40-minutes' walk), between Sabyinyo and Gahinga. Agashya Group, also known by its former name Group Thirteen, usually lives close to the Sabyinyo Group but can range very far and high. It has about 25 gorillas with 2 silverbacks. Usually living between the Karisoke and Visoke (sometimes called Bisoke) peaks are the Amahoro Group, with about 17 individuals, and the Umubano Group, which currently has 11 members. Both are usually further away from the headquarters than the Sabyinyo and Agasha groups, but easier to reach than the Susa Group. Originally studied by Dian Fossey, the Susa Group is the largest, with about 40 individuals, including 3 silverbacks. In the summer months in particular it can be a tough trek to reach this group high up on Mount Karisimbi, but it's well worth the effort because of their number and because, uniquely, it has two sets of twins, a very rare occurrence in the world of gorillas. The Karisimbi Group, which split from the Susa group a few years ago, also lives in the Mt. Karisimbi area of Volcanoes National Park and is also suited to visits from more serious hikers. Both of these groups can potentially involve a full day's trek. The Hirwa Group has around 11 members including one silverback and another pair of twins. Together with the two pairs of twins in the Susa group, these are the only known surviving twins of mountain gorillas in the world. The eighth group, the Kwitonda Group has 18 members and was habituated in the DRC. They crossed the border into Rwanda in 2005, and were carefully tracked and are now also being visited on a regular basis, although they are known to range far. 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or both. As we watched the mother, Nyabitondore, care for the apano and Byishimo, at times we thought she would go insane from the task. But today you can enjoy the two bouncing around and playing as if nothing ever happened.

2. Karisimbi Family (Susa-B)

This is the family that split from the Original Susa (Susa-A) family and now it's called Susa-B or Karisimbi Group. It contains 15 individuals and it always stays in the slopes of Karisimbi Volcano (4507M), which the highest pick of Rwanda. The Karisimbi Group is better suited to visits for more serious hikers. It appears that they have established their home range high up on the slopes of the Karisimbi caldera. Thus, a visit to this group may well end up as a full-days trek. The group sometimes migrates to higher altitude and hence makes tracking difficult. However, RDB tourism and conservation guides know where to find the group a day before. Tracking this gorilla family may sometimes be prohibited because of its distant location.

3. Sabyinyo Gorilla Group

Sabyinyo is an easily accessible group led by the powerful silverback Guhonda. Guhonda, the largest silverback of all the groups, who is well known for his massive physical appearance. Guhonda has kept his main challenger, Ryango, out of his group as a lonely silverback. There are fewer members within this family than in the other groups however they are equally impressive as a family.

The group was named after the Sabyinyo volcano which means "old man's teeth". Sabyinyo is one of the groups closest to the park's edge with 8 individuals: 1 Silverback (the biggest in the park); 3 Adult females; 1 Non adult female; 2 Juveniles and 1 Baby.



### 4. Amahoro Gorilla Group

Meaning "peaceful group", Amahoro, is the most peaceful of all the gorilla groups. The group has 17 individuals: 1 Silverback; 2 Blackbacks; 5 Adult females; 2 Sub adult males; 2 Juveniles and 5 Babies. However, peace comes at a price Ubumwe, the group's silverback is so peaceful, easy going and calm, he has lost group members to Charles in the Umubano group.

To reach Amahoro one must endure a fairly steep climb however the climb is well worth it once in contact with this tranquil group



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### 5. Umubano Group

Meaning "neighborliness", Umubano a family of 11 individuals: 1 Silverback; 1 Sub adult male; 3 Adult females and 6 Babies.Umubano were originally Amahoro members but broke off after the dominant silverback (Ubumwe) was challenged by Charles, now the leader of Umubano.

As Charles matured into a silverback of the same rank as Ubumwe, he could not stand being given orders and decided to stage a fight and challenge Ubumwe. The fight went on for weeks and then months. Finally, Charles managed to snatch from Ubumwe a few females and formed his own group; thus Umubano was formed. Since then, he has commanded respect and recognition from Ubumwe. We have observed, on various occasions, interactions between the two silverbacks, but no fighting has been seen since the great battle ended.



### 6. 13 Group (aka Agasha Group)

When first habituated this group had only 13 members hence its name. Now the group has approximately 25 members: 1 Silverback; 12 Adult females; 2 Sub adult female; 3 Juvenile and 7 Babies. Formerly this group was commanded by Nyakarima who was challenged by Agashya meaning "the news". Agashya indeed made news by first watching and estimating Nyakarima's strengths and eventually challenging him to a fierce fight by taking off with his whole group. This was a shock to Nyakarima and an unprecedented event in observed gorilla history. Agashya then moved up the volcano to secure his group and make sure Nyakarima did not track them. Agashya has since increased his group's numbers by snatching from other groups and assimilating other lone gorillas, rapidly increasing the group from 12 to 25 individuals.

Agashya is known, at the first sign of trouble, to take his whole group up to the top of the volcano. Once, while we were taking a group of tourists to see Group 13 this exact scenario unfolded. Agashya felt that there was another silverback who was about to challenge him. In response, he took the group up the volcano. Every time

we thought we were close to see them, Agashya would move the group further uphill. We did not reach them until the very top, where we finally got a chance to see them. By the time we got back to the car we had walked for 12 hours. While it was an exhausting day, it was magical to see gorillas at the top the world.



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### 7. Kwitonda Family

This 18-member group is led by a silverback known as Kwitonda which means "humble one" and has two silverbacks and one blackback. Having migrated from DRC, this group tends to range far making it a moderately difficult trek. Together with Susa B this is one of the difficult groups to track



### 8. Hirwa Group (meaning "lucky one")

This group came into the lime light on the 17th of June 2006 when trackers witnessed its formation by the merging of some members from two different existing families, namely from Group 13 and Sabyinyo making a very small group then. As luck would have it, other gorillas joined the group and now Hirwa has 9 individuals: 1 Silverback; 3 Adult females; 2 Sub adult females and 3 Babies.

Despite being the newest group on the block, Hirwa exhibits strength and holds its own amongst all the other established groups.



### 9. Bwenge Family

The family size of this group is 11 individuals with Silverback. It is mostly found on the Slopes of the Karisoke Volcano. The group is led by a silverback named Bwenge and was formed in 2007 when he left his natal group and was gradually joined by females from other groups. This group has had some hard times; this is because there were some deaths of 6 infants. However now the group is growing strong with 2 successful births in the last few years and a strong capable silverback leader. The trek to see the group is tough and one has to hike up the hill or like 3 hours (gaining approximately 600m in elevation). The trails are sometimes muddy and very steep. Apparently it was also the group that was featured in the movie "Gorillas in the Mist".

### 10. Ugenda Family

This Group is found in Karisimbi area of Rwanda. The Family Size consists of 11 gorillas with 2 silverbacks. Its name means "being on the move" and was named because it was always moving from one area to another. Since it's not in one place, tracking it may be some how difficult and involves also moving from one place to another to locate them.

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
#### Agashya Group in Volcanoes National Park

By Gorilla Doctors - Updated over a year ago

From Dr. Jean-Felix Kinani in Volcanoes National Park, Rwanda:

I trekked to Agashya group for a Routine Health Check on February 5. The group was found in the Nyabigoma area of the park at an altitude of 2557 meters. Agashya, the dominant silverback was feeding during the time of my observation, and moving with the infant gorillas of the group. Infants Inyungu and Isano were playing and very active. Adult female Turiho appeared fine, but was aggressive to any of the gorillas that tried to play with her infant Iwacu. Sacco, the 2.5-year-old infant of adult female Isoni, appeared to be healthy and thriving despite his mother leaving the group on January 20. Sacco has been sleeping with silverback Agashya in his night nest since his mother left. He is becoming more independent and he was feeding abundantly during my observation. Trackers reported that after his mother left, Sacco had stopped playing and became depressed. Recently however, he seems to be more active and stays close to Agashya for protection and companionship. Ubudehe, another infant whose mother left the group a few months back, is also staying close to Agashya. Gasozikeza, Inyungu, Iwacu and Ingabo were all resting during my observation but seem to be in good health.

All of the gorillas in Agashya group were observed and were visually in good health.





# Respiratory Disease breaks out in the Agashya Gorilla Group

Home Blog Respiratory Disease breaks out in the Agashya Gorilla Group

On August 28, the trackers in Volcanoes National Park announced that Agashya, who is the prominent silverback of the Agashya group, was actually coughing however he was not doing badly. The Gorilla Doctors inspected him frequently and discovered he was active and ok in spite of a cold. Later on 8<sup>th</sup> of the very month, another gorilla within the group, was discovered coughing by the trackers. 4 days afterwards, Elisabeth Nyirakaragire the Veterinary Warden of Volcanoes National Park reported that 4 additional gorillas were suffering from respiratory disease. In particular, Isano was fatigued, consequently Elisabeth asked for a veterinary examination.

On 14th September the Agashya group had 6 gorillas coughing among which were Dusangire, Gasozikeza, Gusura, Agashya, Ubudehe as well as Isano. Gasozikeza was actually coughing very much, compared to the others; however he was feeding as well as tinkering with Gusura, Dusangire plus Ubudehe. Isano was also coughing although was lively and moving together with the rest of the

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group. Trackers stated he had become better. Agashya, who previously was coughing for 3 weeks, remained coughing; however he was feeding as well as moving effectively. Not one of the gorillas looked really sick.

On 18th September among the group Gasozikeza,
Ubutware,Turiho,Ubudehe as well as Isano were actually still
coughing, however still behaving normally. For that reason it was
decided that these cases weren't serious to warrant an treatment.
Outbreaks of Respiratory diseases are generally due to a selfrestricting viral infection. At times gorillas having viral infections obtain
a additional bacterial infection and turn into serious illness. In such
cases the doctors get involved by offering antibiotics to assist the
gorillas recuperate.

On 25<sup>th</sup> September it was observed that 6 gorillas continued coughing among which were Intambwe, Intambwe, Intango, Ubutwari, Inkundwa, as well as Turiho . Among the Eleven gorillas that were affected at this point, Ingabo, Isano, Gusura, Agashya plus Ubudehe, appear to have well recovered. The young Ubutwari was alsocoughing quiet a lot as well as picking at his nose, however he was walking with Agashya and also feeding well. Regardless of accounts that Intango seemed to be not using at all her left-arm, she appeared well and was actually moving with the two arms.

Trackers continue to observe the gorillas to gather information about their general health status as always and gather the stool of the unwell gorillas so that the veterinaries can try to discover the pathogen triggering this outbreak.



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
#### From "Gorilla Encounter" in "The Far Side of the Sky":

Terrible ghosts haunt this country and this mountainside. Ghosts of almost a million people slaughtered during the Rwandan genocide of 1994, moderate Hutus as well as 70% of the Tutsi then living in Rwanda. All this while the world stood by and did nothing. The engandered mountain gorillas of the Virunga Mountains might also have been victims of the senseless slaughter if it had not been for the remarkable and pioneering work the anthropologist, Dian Fossey. As fellow anthropologist Jane Goodall has written "if Dian hadn't done what she had, there would be no gorillas left in Rwanda to study.". Dian conducted the first field study

of these mountain gorillas. She lived and worked beside them in these mountains (near where the Susa group is marked on the map below) and recorded her experience in her best seller ``Gorillas in the Mist". She was murdered by unknown assailants and her grave in the mountains near where she worked has become a place of pilgrimage and a popular hiking destination. One of her favorite subjects, a silverback called Digit, was murdered with her and lies in an adjoining grave.

The hike to visit the mountain gorillas in the wild is an extraordinary experience because of the fantastic opportunity to interact with these magnificent animals in the wild and to observe them close up for a period of an hour. It is a guided hike into the higher reaches of the volcanic Virunga Mountains that range up to 12,000ft and straddle the border separating the central African countries of Rwanda, Uganda and the Democratic Republic of the Congo. The three countries have established contiguous national parks in order to preserve this unique environment: they are called the Volcanoes National Park in Rwanda, the Mgahinga National Park in Uganda and Virunga National Park in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Most of the visitors come to the Rwandan park since travel there is more convenient and safer and the facilities are better developed. The Ugandan park is harder to access and less developed while conditions in the Congolese park are very unsettled and potentially dangerous.

A line of volcanoes on the international borders (including the 11,959ft Mount Sabyinyo) overlook the park area that is mostly bamboo forest. The bamboo provides the fodder for the 800 or so gorillas that live there in small groups of up to 25 or so animals. In the Rwandan Park there are currently 8 gorilla groups that are habituated to humans and can be visited by tourists; another four gorilla groups have not been habituated and are the restricted to research study.



Map of the Volcanoes National Park showing the habituated gorilla groups.

The 8 habituated gorilla groups that can be visited in the Rwandan Park at present are shown in the above map in their rough area of activity. Dian Fossey's original study group are represented by their descendants in the Susa groups, Susa A and Susa B, that are the result of a split in 2010. The present habituated groups are:

- Susa A Group with three silverbacks, Kurira, Kika and Igisha, and 29 gorillas. The group lives on the slopes of mountain Karisimbi. One of the females, Nyabitondore, is the daughter of Picasso, a gorilla that was studied by Dian Fossey; another female, Isonga, is the daughter of Poppy, also studied by Fossey. A peculiarity of this group is that it has had two sets of twins born in recent years. The last birth occurred when Nyabitondore gave birth to male and female twins which she has subsequently successfully raised.
- Susa B Group with the silverback Kuramba and 11 gorillas.
- Sabyinyo Group with the enormous silverback Guhonda and eight gorillas. Guhonda is thought to be the largest in the world. He loves to beat his chest to demonstrate his power. The group is usually located in the depression between the peaks of Mount Gahinga and Mount Sabyinyo around 1 to 1.5 hours walk from the trailhead.
- Agashya Group (or Group 13) with silverback Agashya and 25 gorillas. This group gets its name from the fact that it was the thirteenth group to be habituated in this area (see below for more detail). It is the group that the author visited.
- Amahoro Group with silverback Ubumwe and 17 gorillas. Amahoro means peace, reflecting the easy-going nature of this family, the silverback being particularly relaxed and approachable. The antecedent of this group was one led by the silverback Amahoro who died in 2002; the original group then split into that led by Ubumwe and one named Umubano led by the silverback Charles. Ubumwe has been having intermittent spats with Charles since then and there has been a loss of members in that direction. The Amahoro Group is usually located on the slopes of Mount Visoke around 1 to 1.5 hours walk from the trailhead.
- Umubano Group with silverback Charles and 9 gorillas. Previously part of the Amahoro Group, when the old silverback died, Charles was not prepared to submit to the second ranking male and, after months of tension and fighting, he decided to

- leave the group, taking two females with him. Under his ambitious leadership, the three have since been joined by other females. The group is usually located around 0.5 to 1 hour walk from the trailhead.
- Hirwa Group with the silverback "SB" and 12 gorillas. This Group has 12 members most of whom came from the Sabyinyo and Group 13 groups after the new alpha SB triumphed in a big silverback battle on Jun.17, 2006. The Group, renowned for being peaceful and easy-going, is usually located around 1 to 2 hours walk from the trailhead.
- Kwitonda Group with silverback Kwitonda and 17 gorillas. Their original home range was over the border in the Democratic Republic of Congo but they migrated to Rwanda in 2005 with sixteen members. The Group was already habituated when it arrived although the silverback is notoriously shy. The Group is usually located around 2 to 3 hours walk from the trailhead.

In addition there are four non-habituated research groups named, Beetsme, Pablo, Shinda and Bwenge.

We describe here a hike that visited the Agashya Group (or Group 13) in November of 2014. When first habituated this group had only 13 members (hence its name). Now the group has approximately 25 members: 1 silverback; 12 adult females; 2 sub-adult females; 3 juveniles and 7 babies. After the death of the silverback Murith in 1992 all of the females left to join other families leaving just three young males, Munani, Nyakarima and Kwirinda. These three stayed on their own for several years until Munani became a silverback. Subsequently Nyakarima left to join another family and Kwarinda died after a fight. Munani managed to obtain one female, Safari, from the Sabyinyo group and later two other females, Gukunda and Cyazuzo. From there he was able to rebuild the family to 8 individuals.

Munani died of natural causes in 2002, leaving the group without a silverback. The lead female, Safari, took over the leadership for five difficult months. Nyakarima reappeared and a new silverback, Agashya, meaning ``the news", arrived on the scene with three friends. Agashya made news by first watching and estimating Nyakarima's strengths and eventually challenging him to a fierce fight by taking off with his whole group. This was a shock to Nyakarima and an unprecedented event in observed gorilla history. Agashya then moved up the volcano to secure his group and make sure Nyakarima did not track them. Agashya has since increased his group's numbers by snatching from other groups and assimilating other lone gorillas, rapidly increasing the group from 12 to 25 individuals. Nyakarima is now a lone silverback. Agashya is known, at the first sign of trouble, to take his whole group up to the top of the volcano. Once, when taking a group of tourists to see Group 13 this exact scenario unfolded. Agashya felt that there was another silverback who was about to challenge him. In response, he took the group up the volcano. Every time the tourists came close, Agashya would move the group further uphill. The tourists finally got a chance to see them near the top of the mountain. By the time they got back to the trailhead, they had walked for an exhausting 12 hours.

The Agashya group of 25 gorillas is usually located about 0.5 to 1hrs from the trailhead and in November 2014 consisted of

- Silverback: Agashya
- Females: Safari, Gukunda, Cyazuzo, Kwisanga (mother of Ingabo), Munezero, Infango, Rugendo, Ahazaza, Akago, Isani
- Juvenile: Icyozuzo
- Infants: Ingabo, Karema, Inkundwa, Izano, Dusangire, Gasipildira, Urumuli, Tunha

We describe a November 2014 trek to visit this group. We note that one way in which individual gorillas can be identified is by the pattern of creases on their flat nose just above their nostrils. Photographs of the individuals in a group often come with a small diagram of these crease patterns but I confess I found it hard to distinguish these myself.

#### Trailhead

The city closest to the gorillas is Musanze (formerly Ruhengeri), the regional capital and second largest city in Rwanda located at 1°30.228'S 29°38.307'E and an elevation of 6033ft. While an airport is currently planned for Musanze (primarily to serve the tourist trade), the most convenient itinerary at present (2014) is to travel by road from the Rwandan capital of Kigali. Kigali can be reached by air from several nearby route centers including Nairobi. The journey from Kigali to Musanze along Route RN4 travels a distance of 58mi (93km) over a good paved road through productive farmland. It is a scenic drive of about 1.2hrs. The roads beyond Musanze and up toward the park are considerably rougher. The Volcanoes National Park Headquarters at Kinigi (at 1°25.937'S 29°35.691'E, elevation 7615ft) is about 7.5mi from Musanze along Route RN8 on a fair, paved road. The Kinigi National Park Headquarters are where you meet with your guides on the morning of your trek to visit with the gorillas.


We stayed in the midrange Mountain Gorilla View Lodge (at 1°25.630'S 29°33.359'E, elevation 8029ft) that is about 3.5mi (5.5km) west of the Park Headquarters. About 1.5mi (2.5km) ENE is the upscale and expensive Sabyinyo Silverback Lodge at 1°24.776'S 29°34.085'E and an elevation of 8344ft.

The demand for participation in a trek to the gorillas is high and so it is almost essential that you acquire a reservation prior to day of your hike and usually weeks in advance. The orientation at the Kinigi Headquarters (at 1°25.937'S 29°35.691'E, elevation 7615ft) occurs about 7.00am on the morning of the trek. This involves registering your presence with the National Park Office. The rangers then allocate you to a specific gorilla group. The scouts whose job it is to follow the 8 habituated groups night and day (and year round) keep the headquarters staff informed of the rough location of each of the groups. With this information the staff are able to estimate the probable length of the hike to see each group on that particular day. Headquarters then assign the visitors to a specific group; I got the impression that they take into account the perceived fitness and age of each visitor in deciding upon that allocation. There is a strict limit of one group of visitors to each gorilla group on any day and a visitor group is limited to a maximum of 8 individuals. Moreover, each visit is limited to a period of one hour in the presence of the gorillas.







Start of the trek

Care must be taken to bring with you appropriate clothing and equipment for the trek. Lightweight safari shirt and pants with long sleeves and legs are best along with hiking shoes or boots. Since rain (or pushing through wet foliage) is likely you might also bring a lightweight rain jacket. Conversely a hat and sunglasses are important in the case of hot sun. Gloves (and the long sleeves) are recommended as protection against the stinging nettles that are common in the bamboo rain forest. A lightweight backpack is also useful to carry your bottled water and other gear (though this should be kept to a minimum).

Once the allocations have been decided you then meet in your small group of eight (or less) with your principal guide(s) for the day. Most of them speak good English and, perhaps, French. They give you a brief description of the gorilla group to be visited and its recent history; this includes photographs of each of the current members of the group and the pattern of the nose creases for each individual. Then you are given instructions regarding the visit, the need to obey all instructions from the guides and not to use flash photography or make any loud noises or rapid movements. No contact with the gorillas is permitted (especially with the young gorillas) because of their vulnerability to human diseases; if you have a cold or fever you are not permitted to participate in a trek. You should not make direct eye contact with the gorillas but rather bow your head and emit a purring noise if there appears to be an


imminent confrontation. With all these preliminaries completed you then reboard your vehicle for the journey to the trailhead for your particular trek.

The chosen trailhead is likely accessed over very rough 4WD track. Nevertheless, since the nearby farms extend right up to the boundaries of the park in most places there is likely to be a crowd of children waiting to greet you. In addition to the guides and trackers (in dark green uniforms) there will also be a group of potential porters in blue jumpsuits. They will be there in the hope of being hired by tourists to carry their backpacks and help them over and across obstacles. A porter costs \$10 per hike and is well worth it; moreover, this income greatly helps the local economy and, with all the other financial contributions from visitors, helps to enlist the local population in the protection of the park and the gorillas against poaching and other predations. Once equipped with porters (who also provide walking sticks) your group is ready to begin the hike.

#### Hike

Our allocated trailhead lay just a few hundred yards ESE of the Sabyinyo Silverback Lodge along a rough dirt road through populated farmland. It seemed a well-used trailhead where a group of some 20 potential porters waited with a group of children including several young infants. I estimate the location was about 1°25.089'S 29°34.522'E and an elevation of 8150ft on the slopes of the 11,959ft Mount Sabyinyo. Once assembled and provided with porters we started up a gently sloping trail through farmland with Mount Sabyinyo volcano directly ahead of us. The slope gradually increased as we began to leave the farmed fields behind. After less than a mile we arrive at the low stone wall and ditch that mark the edge of the forest in the park. The wall helps prevent incursions of the local population into the park and to dissuade the wildlife from roaming onto the farmland. At this point we were unexpectedly joined by a small group of well-armed soldiers who seemed to appear from nowhere. Our guides explained that the soldiers were there as extra protection against armed poachers but I wondered whether they were also there to deter any potential incursions from across the nearby border with the Democratic Republic of the Congo (either by the Congolese army or by rebel groups in that country).

It was easy to climb the wall, cross the ditch and enter the dense bamboo of the National Park; having done so, we immediately found ourselves in the dense bamboo forest with only indistinct animal trails to follow. One of the trackers preceded us, occasionally hacking away at path-blocking bamboo branches. We had gone only a short distance before we were told to be quiet and move slowly. And there ahead of us were two juvenile mountain gorillas grooming one another. It was a truly incredible moment. Even more so as we advanced a short distance and caught sight of the silverback, Agashya, sleeping in a bamboo grove surrounded by about a dozen females and infants. I estimate our gorilla encounter occured about 1°24.46'S 29°34.74'E at an elevation of 8700ft and less than a mile from the trailhead. Thus we had ascended only about 550ft during our approach hike.





It was not long before Agashya woke up and decided to move a short distance north in order to feed. Most of the troop followed as he led them through the forest to a spot where it appeared there was good bamboo to eat. Meanwhile several of the young gorillas who had been frolicking a short distance away came bouncing by, playfully knocking each other over as they went. Apparently the bamboo includes fermented material and some of the gorillas end up quite inebriated as a result. Certainly these young gorillas were behaving just like young humans after a night out.

Soon Agashya settled down for another sleep with many of his troop spread out around him including younsters who climbed on his back without incurring any wrath. Our guides led us to locations where we had excellent views of this non-activity though in doing so we paused at the edge of one path just as a young gorilla was charging through the bamboo to join the main group. In doing so he passed very close to me and flung out his arm as if to say "get out of my way". The brief and inconsequential contact he made with me will remain a very special memory from this incredible encounter.

As the end of our hour approached, Agashya and the group moved off again, now through denser undergrowth with stinging nettles and less chance to get good views of the gorillas. I felt as though I might abruptly bump into a gorilla with little warning or intention. But then, sadly our hour was up and we began to make our way back toward the same place where we had crossed the boundary wall and ditch. Just before that we encountered an overgrown brick chimney, very strangely all that remains of the

homestead of a man called Condit who had long ago built this refuge in the territory of the mountain gorillas. How and why was not known but I whispered thanks that this homestead was short-lived.

Just outside the wall we paused for reflection and for drinks. We exchanged emails and impressions of this extraordinary experience. We thanked our guides and porters and said goodbye to the army patrol that had joined us. We were elated by what we had experienced and chatted excitedly as we hiked downhill to the trail and then the trailhead. There the same group of children awaited our return and asked nicely for handouts though without the agression one can experience elsewhere in poorer countries. It had been a truly amazing and unique experience like no other this earth has to offer. Though very expensive (\$750 per person for one encounter) it was definitely worth the money, especially since the financial contribution provides major support for the survival of this magnificent species.

## Welcome to Baines' Camp!

We have put this leaflet together to help you settle into your room and find your way around the camp. Please take a few minutes to read through these notes.

On the main dresser, you will find two leather folders. One contains an orientation of Baines' Camp, including information on the concession we share with Stanley's Camp, the local community and the activities we have on offer.

The second folder contains writing paper, postcards and envelopes, which you are welcome to make use of during your stay with us. Please note that we do sell postage stamps should you wish to make use of the postcards provided. You will also find someinformation about the Living With Elephants Foundation and the helicopter that can be arranged for you in consultation with one of the managers.

We offer a complimentary, same-day service. Please put all laundry, together with the laundry list (which can be found in the stationary folder) into the cane basket in the bathroom. Our housekeepers will remove your laundry each morning while you are out on your activity, and return it to you that same evening.

There may be occasions when your laundry is not ready that evening (i.e. due to inclement weather), in which case it will be returned to you the following morning.

The lodge runs on 2 separate power source - direct current from the generator, and battery power supplied from the inverter. Your lights and fan run 24 hours a day, as they work off a battery source. There are two plug points provided for charging camera batteries and using the hairdryers. The first of these is located in the main bedroom by the corner seat; the second by the cane laundry basket in the bathroom. Adaptors are located in the top drawer of the dresser.

Please note that the plug points are run by generator power, which will be available at the following hours:

## 6am - 10.00pm

Please do not use the plugs located under your bed - the power source there is different, and using these plugs may result in temporary loss of all power to your room.

Peaceful Sleep is an insect repellent that is sprayed onto the body. This can be found in the top right hand drawer of the main dresser. It is advised that you spray yourself liberally with Peaceful Sleep before you go on game drive in the afternoon and again before coming through to dinner. It is during the evening that the risk of being bitten is greatest. An Africology citronella insect repellent can be found in the container between the basins in the bathroom. This is made using 100% natural essential oils and great for using on your face and neck.

The housekeepers will drop your mosquito nets around the beds while you are enjoying dinner. If you find you have a lot of insects in your room, you are welcome to use the Doom spray (in the drawer with the Peaceful Sleep) to help control the problem. Please do not use this product on your skin.

You will see a few spiders around your room. Most of these are flat spiders that live on the walls or in crevices. These spiders are harmless to you and wonderfully efficient in dealing with mosquitoes, so we recommend you try to live with them, rather than exterminate them!

Other points of interest

- On the bottom shelf underneath the safe, you will find a watercolour painting kit, which we hope will encourage you to follow Thomas Baines' example and create your own interpretation of African landscape. Please feel free to try your hand at a painting, using the paper located in the second drawer of the main dresser.
- A shoe-shining kit is also located at the bottom of the wardrobe. Please leave your shoes in the box for the housekeepers to clean for you.
- The mini bar is stocked daily with mineral water. Please advise management if there are any additional drinks you would like to have placed in the bar.
- Please note that we do not have telephone, cell phone facilities. Urgent messages to friends and family can be given to management who will contact our office in Maun. Our colleagues in Maun can phone through on your behalf.
- We do have a wireless internet facility available at Baines for your convenience. If you are traveling with your laptop or a device with internet connectivity, please feel to use this in the main area of the lodge.
- The water in your rooms is treated and filtered so is safe for brushing teeth, showering etc. However, it is recommended you use the mineral water provided for drinking. If you have a sensitive stomach or are concerned about the quality of the water, please use the bottled water for cleaning teeth.
- The water used in the ice machine and for washing vegetables/fruit is purified and filtered, so is 100% safe to consume.

Safety in camp

There is a safe provided in your room for locking away valuables.

# DIGITAL ELECTRONIC SAFE OPERATING INSTRUCTION

- 1. Open the door
- 2. Press the reset button on the inside of the door until you hear a short beep
- 3. Key in your new pin code (3 digits) while the orange reset light is still on.
- 4. Press key (A) to confirm new code.
- 5. Turn the knob to close the door.
- 6. To open, key in the new pin number press the (A) button and turn the knob while the green light is showing.

After 3 consecutive incorrect attempts, the safe will automatically shut down for 20 seconds. Please wait before try again.

- A hand held radio will be placed in your room every evening for use in an emergency situation, or if you need assistance in any way. To operate, please turn the RIGHT knob to ON (volume control). The left knob will be set to channel 1. Hold down the rectangular button on the left and speak clearly into the radio about 3inches from your mouth. Once finished speaking release the button and wait for reply. Please call for manager's assistance by calling "Baines Camp, Baines Camp for Room 5 "(e.g.) While waiting for a response please remember to release the button on the left, only pressing it in when you wish to speak. Once you have spoken to the manager and have finished the conversation, please do turn your radio to OFF.
- The air-horn, located next to your safe, is used to alert management in an emergency situation, particularly if you are experiencing a serious medical problem. Please do not use in any other circumstances.
- Please do not walk unescorted at night for any reason we do not have an electric fence around our camp, and animals often roam through the camp on their nightly forays. Our night watchmen will be on duty to escort you to and from your room after dark and will arrange pick-up / drop-off times with you when you come back from your evening drive.
- During the night, there may be hippos and other animals passing close to your room. Please don't panic they will not climb up onto the deck to investigate as they are more frightened of you than you are of them. Enjoy the sounds of Africa knowing that you are very safe in the comfort of your bed.
- Please note that when walking around camp during the day, there is still a possibility that you will encounter animals, particularly elephant. In such instances, please walk slowly and calmly to the nearest building. Do not take your eyes off the animal and don't make any sudden movements or loud noises. Do not try to get close to any wild animal; rather let them move off before you try to walk past.

Morning and afternoon game drives in open-sided Land cruisers are on offer. Morning drives usually depart the lodge at 6:30am, arriving back in camp between 10:30am – 11:00am.

Afternoon drives depart the lodge at 3:30pm and arrive back in camp between 6:30pm – 7.00pm.

We can offer guided walks, which provide a great opportunity to see the smaller details of this incredible ecosystem and also to experience the sounds and smells that are often missed on the vehicle. We recommend that you walk in the morning as the tracks of nocturnal animals are visible then and the weather is cooler.

During the flood season, we also offer boat safaris and mokoro trips. With these activities the focus is more on the water environment and enjoying the tranquility of the delta, than for game viewing (although elephant, hippos, and sometime lion can be seen from the boat). Motor boat trips are also an idea way of enjoying a peaceful Africa sunset, often in the company of few hippos'. Mokoro trips (i.e. traditional dug out canoe) are ideally suits to the morning when is it still cool, although they can be arranged at any time that suit you. Please speak to your guide or a member of the management team to find out which activities are currently available.

If you are interested in booking the elephant walk or helicopter flight, please speak to one of the managers who will advise of relevant costs and all details pertaining to the activity.

#### Dinaka

Welcome to "Dinaka", the namesake of your suite which is centred around Thomas Baines' "Gold and ivory elephants charging over quartose country" painting. The true meaning behind the canvas is found in its name, which indicates the wealth that was to be found in Zimbabwe i.e. in the elephants' ivory tusks and the gold-bearing rocks.

Africa was seen as a land of opportunity and Thomas Baines exchanged his carefree lifestyle for four years, between 1868 and 1872, in order to exploit the gold deposits of Zimbabwe. This not only gave him a means to provide for himself but also gave rise to exciting opportunities to paint and travel further.


Baines joined forces with Henry Hartley, a renowned explorer of Botswana and Zimbabwe; they reached the borders of Zimbabwe in June of 1869 where they were held up with the red tape of obtaining formal permission to proceed. Their arrival could not have been at a more inconvenient time due to political issues within the Ndebele tribe.

During this uncertain period the ongoing search for gold continued, and Baines successfully pegged his first claim in September 1869. Shortly thereafter all the Europeans (hunters, prospectors and tourists) were ordered to leave Zimbabwe as the Ndebele leaders were in a delicate political phase and wanted no foreigners in the country. There was no alternative for Baines but to move south. This led to flared tempers as he and his fellow Europeans encountered increasing heat and battled against the outbreak of disease.

While they waited for the Ndebele to resolve their kingship issues, Baines remained upbeat and was known for his entertaining personality. He once again took up his brush and began selling his works to willing purchasers, as he was in need of finance both in his professional and personal capacity.

Now that you have had a brief insight into Thomas Baines' life, we hope you enjoy your stay in Dinaka and discover all the wealth that Baines' Camp has to offer you.




