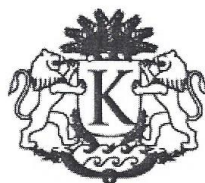

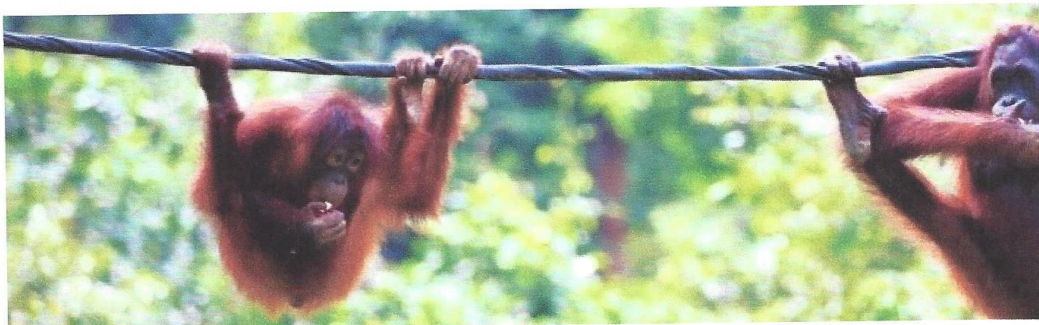

It is also an important timber exporting port. The town has an airport for domestic flights.

Sandakan is the second-largest city in Sabah, East Malaysia, on the north-eastern coast of Borneo. It is located on the east coast of the

Borneo still conjures images of mysterious myths and legends. Borneo remains most famous for its tales and stories about headhunters. Already in early colonial days Borneo gained its reputation as a place where 'head-hunters roam in wild and untamed jungle'. These nomadic tribes were also known as animists. At the start of this millennium, vestiges of these beliefs still remain. This is an ancient burial site that lies within the megalithic belt of the Coast of Northern Borneo. It is believed that this village several years ago with the artifacts findings scattered around the area. Visit the site where the legendary headhunter Monopiad once dwelled and roamed. 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VISA/PASSPORT

U.S. and Canadian citizens are required to have a passport valid for at least six months to enter Malaysia, but do not need to obtain a visa in advance for a pleasure or business trip if their stay in Malaysia is 90 days or less. Travelers are required to carry their passports for travel from peninsular Malaysia to eastern Malaysia (on the island of Borneo) and between the provinces of Sabah and Sarawak, both of which are on Borneo. Entry stamps issued at immigration points such as KLIA airport, Johor Bahru, and Kota Kinabalu (Sabah) for entry into peninsular Malaysia are not valid for entry into the state of Sarawak and usually have three months' validity. New entry stamps must be obtained upon arrival at Kuching or Miri airports in Sarawak. In most cases, entry stamps issued by Sarawak immigration officials are valid for any part of Malaysia and usually have one month's validity. Please note obtaining a visa is your responsibility. These requirements change often and therefore it is best that you check with the Embassy of Malaysia for the most up to date visa information.

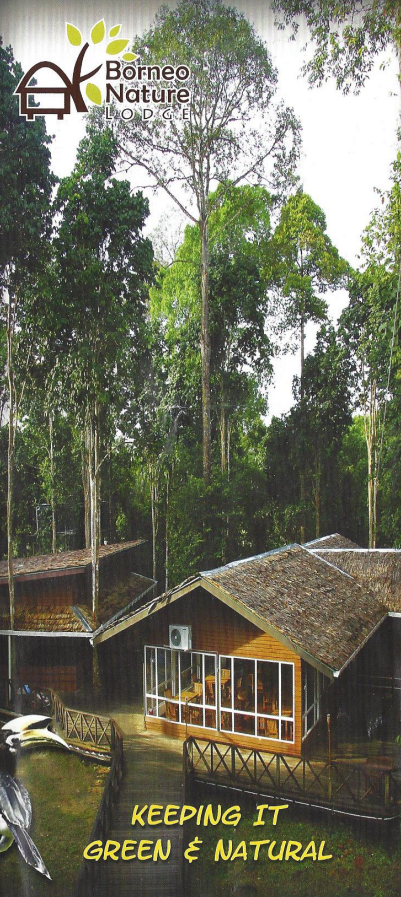
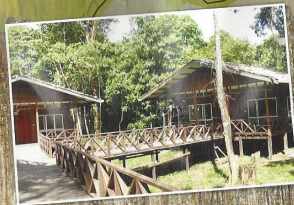
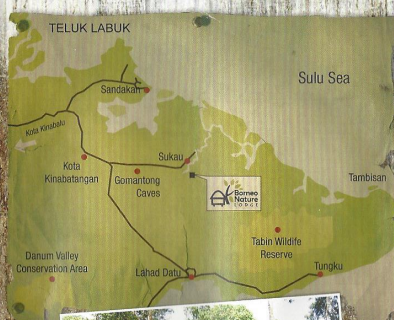


All these wildlife ...

The Lower Kinabatangan has the richest concentration of wildlife in South East Asia. It is home to many rare and endangered animals like the Proboscis monkeys, Orang Utans, Pygmy elephants and the Estuarine crocodiles that are frequently sighted in their natural habitats. 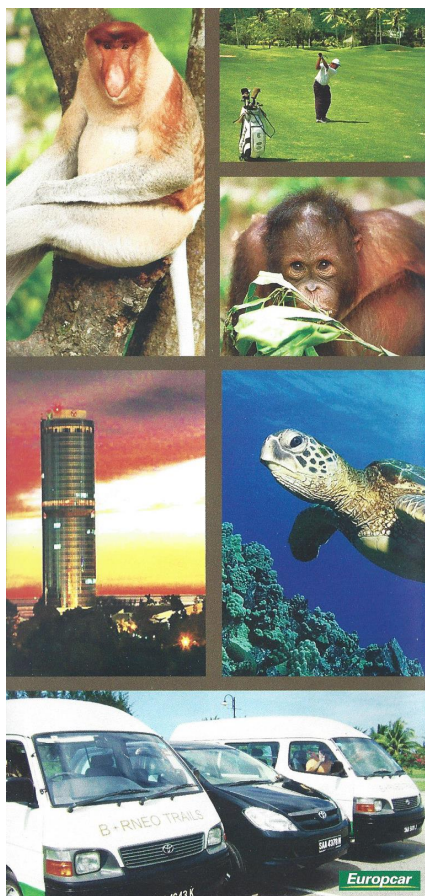

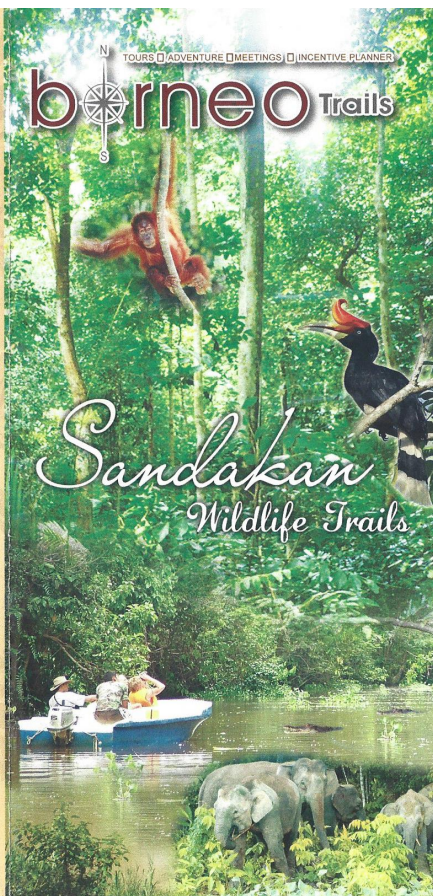

Kogiu or Kisau (Sabah natives language)

Habitat: Mostly lowland and swamp forest

Status: Endangered

Population: About 11,000 in Sabah, Malaysian Borneo

Distribution & Population:

Orang-utans occur mainly in lowland tropical rain forests. On Borneo Island, they are in Malaysia (states of Sabah and Sarawak) and Indonesia (provinces of Central, West and East Kalimantan). In Sarawak, there are about 1,300 orang-utans almost all in the Lanjak-Entimau Wildlife Sanctuary and Batang Ai National Park in the south next to West Kalimantan, Indonesia. Meanwhile in Sabah, the orang-utan population size is approximately 11,000 individuals in year 2003. The world-famous orang-utan rehabilitation centre at Sepilok Forest Reserve has served since 1964, and continues to serve very important roles in saving individual orang-utans displaced by forest clearance elsewhere, and in educating about the need for wildlife conservation. However, the Reserve in itself is not enough for conserving the species in the long-term.

Significant areas for long-term conservation:

1. Ulu Segama-Malua forests (approx. 5,000)
2. Kinabatangan North area, including Deramakot (approx. 1,700)
3. Tabin Wildlife Reserve (approx. 1,400)
4. Lower Kinabatangan (approx. 1,100)
5. Kulamba Wildlife Reserve (approx. 500)

Borneo has 3 populations/subspecies:

- *Pongo pygmaeus pygmaeus* (western populations)
- *Pongo pygmaeus morio* (northeast and east populations)
- *Pongo pygmaeus wurmbii* (southern populations)

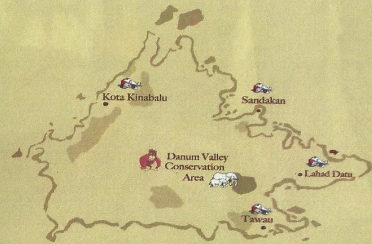
Afternoon : Optional Activities : Tubing session down the river or an option of a jungle trekking, Night Walk on the Nature Trail after dinner.

Optional early morning walk & return to the Lodge for lunch and transfer to Lahad Datu for flights departure.





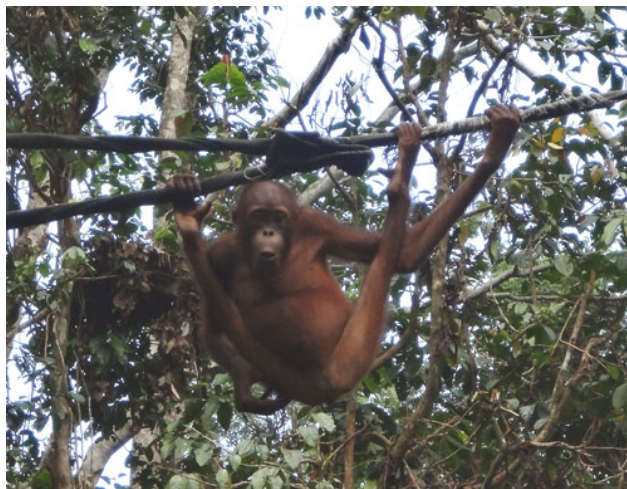

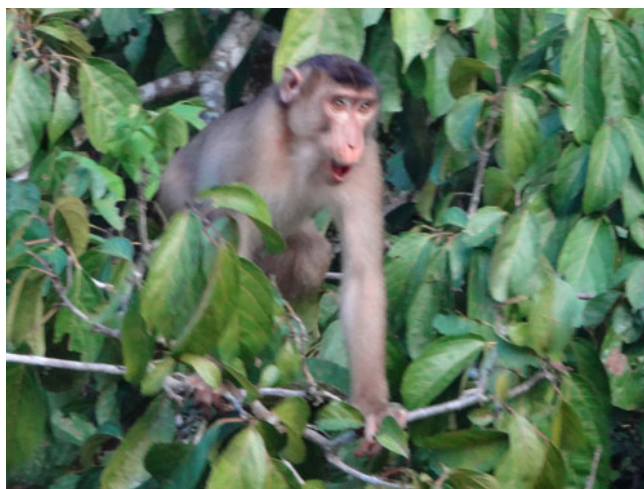

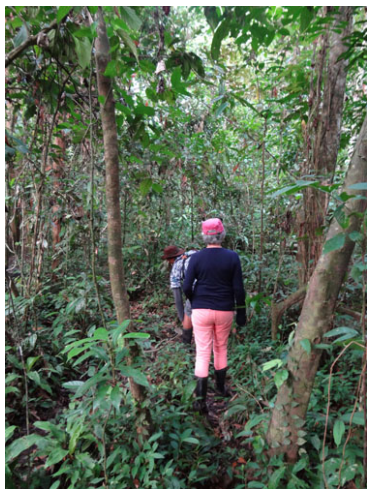

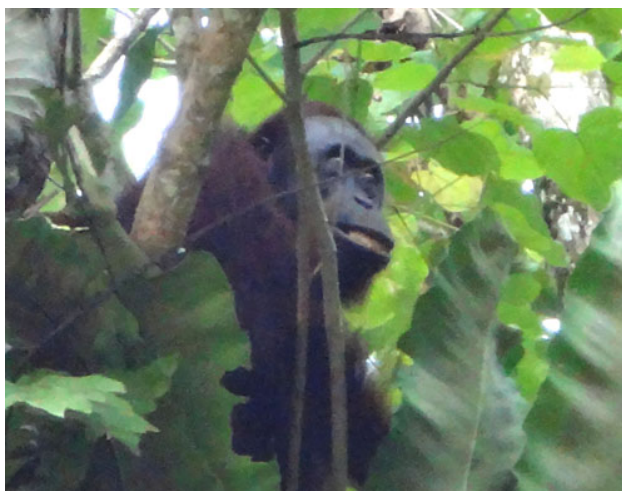

Restaurants:

- * o **Ku De Ta:** Beautiful, expensive (for Bali) and sits on the water. Awesome cocktails and really good food. Do a night there and just sit, eat drink and chill. Try to make it there for sunset.
- o **Rumours:** Good steak and AMAZING mash.
- o **Indian on Legian Rd** (I forget what it's called, but it's in Legian rather than Seminyak) – good Indian
- o **Baron Bay:** Has restaurants all on the water that serve great seafood – to the second one in (second from the left when you're looking at them in the carpark) – get the corn on the cob with chilli – SO GOOD!
- o **Cori:** It's on Poppies 2 in Kuta just down from Legian Rd – request an outside tent/shacky thingy – you sit on the floor and eat – LOVELY! Get the Mahi Mahi or one of the Goreng's (Bahkmi or Nasi) don't get the ribs or the curry.
- o **Italian on the shopping Rd in Kuta....** it's got a hidden doorway that goes upstairs but they do really good pasta – get the ravioli. It's next to the little shopping centre/myer style store there.... Matahari or something? KFC is on the corner of the road.
- o **Cocoon:** For lunch. It's on the beach somewhere between Legian and Seminyak. Really nice.
- o **Warung Bonito** (Seminyak): Nice outside garden for evening meal. Traditional Indonesian
- * o **Bali Café** (Oberoi street Seminyak): Great spot and well priced, cool little setting with a good feel to it, traditional Indonesian with modern twist as well
- * o **Ultimo** (Oberoi Street Seminyak): Range of food prices – great pizza. Great outside area (at the back). Lots of Europeans. Good entertainment *Expensive*.
- o **La Trattoria** (Oberoi Street Seminyak): As above
- o **Poppies:** An oldie but a goody! Beautiful garden setting – great traditional food – always worth a visit. Yummy Chilean wine.
- o **Sarong:** A must, if you lash out for one meal – do it here! You must book. The food prices are actually pretty reasonable (Australian prices Mains 20 -35) as the place is pretty plush itself. You can share dishes as it is Indian/Asian style food. The wine is expensive as with everywhere in Bali – if you are a beer drinker or enjoy a cocktail then this is a great night out. The setting is fantastic, early evening is a great time to be here. The most beautiful restaurant I have ever been to and probably the best meal I have ever had. Quite expensive for Bali but well worth it. You will probably have to book before you go. Also try Ku De Ta apparently just fantastic but will try and go to this one next time, didn't get a chance this time.
- o **Gado Gado:** Beach front restaurant (close to The Sofitel Hotel) Bookings are recommended. Outside dining – ask to be close to the beach. Lovely seafood and modern Australian/European type meals. Again – wine is about \$60 a bottle – cocktails under \$10
- o **La Lucciola:** Classic favourite. Beautiful place to watch sunset. Tasty Italian and seafood
- o **Kafe Warisan:** Might now be called Café Metis. Amazing French cuisine. Great location in rice fields (may have relocated)
- ✓ o **Indo National**
- ✓ o **Mozzarella**

- **Potato Head - must go here. Very lush!**

(near Ku De Ta).
- **Chandi - Oberoi**
- **Seaside, Lanai - Legian Beach**

Bars/Clubs:

- o **Alley Cats:** We went every night to Alley Cats (on Poppies two just down from Cori's – between Cori's and the mini mart down a laneway) cos they have cheap drinks (double vodka redbull for 15,000) and will be full of Aussies
- o **Bounty:** Crap people but ok music, ok cocktails (BIG ONES) and karaoke
- o **Skygarden:** Skygarden has like 5 levels, so it's a good one.
- o **Eikon:** Also good - it's a little further down Legian Rd towards Seminyak (only about 100 metres) and has good music and is a little smaller.
- o **The Rock Bar:** Jimbaran
- o **Poser's Corner:** A great bar, on corner of JL Padma and Rum Jungle Road
- o **Billy's restaurant:** Another great place with great food and drinks, very reasonable. They also have great live bands every night. Opposite this is a bar (forgotten the name however has transvestites at night - apparently very entertaining!! Good night out with a group of people.
- o **The Outrigger:** On the beachfront in Legian/Seminyak is great for cocktails at happy hour between 5 & 7 (I think & cocktails half price)) watch the sunset and also great pizzas and food. This is upstairs at the front. Also along this road just a couple of doors away is the Zanzibar which is also great for dinner and watching sunsets.

Shopping:**Clothe/DVDs/Silver**

Legian Rd towards Seminyak has some cute little boutique's on it with nice clothes. Bought two dresses from "Somewhere". If you are looking for the more boutique shopping, the directions I usually give the taxi driver are to be dropped off at either The Villas hotel – if you start here and look across the road you will see The Hussy Shop – from here down toward the main Legian/Seminyak street – are some great spots. From here either turn left or right (I think I go left) down Legian street and enjoy! The other spot to start is at the top end (away from beach) of Oberoi street (in Seminyak) and walk down towards Ku De Ta direction and again – lots of gorgeous shops. These 2 spots are just my fave's there are LOTS and LOTS of little areas to explore and markets to wander through and shopping centres now.

Specific shops I like include – State of Georgia, Magali Pascal, Allegra (stocks Natasha), Hussy, Lu Lu and Uma and Leopold.

There is a shopping mall that you can get to by walking about 1km down Kuta Beach that has good shops

Garlic Lane is also great for shopping get some great bargains on t-shirts, shoes, etc. Don't pay any more than 40,000-60,000 rp for a good guys t-shirt. Sunnies are also plentiful and the going rate for these is 25,000 to 30,000rp

Poppies 2 has DVD places all along it

Galaxy – next to Bintang Supermarket

If you like silver there is some great silver shops - Perlu and Joy which is on Oberoi near the restaurants above and also Bintang Silver in Legian, same road as the Melasti Spa (walk out of the

Centro Shopping Centre - opposite Water Bom Park

spa dn turn left). Got some great pieces here. Perlu is more expensive but beautiful and I got some great bangles here.

Water and Money:

Commonwealth ATMs are available in circle K's and mini marts. Try not to use the other ones cos I've heard stories of cards being eaten. Water is pretty cheap so buy the big bottles for brushing teeth etc

Spas:

Day Spas

- **Febris Day Spa (Kuta):** Really cheap one (has really nice little rooms out the back) – If you have a Package or go with someone else I think you are in these – definitely ask for this.
- **Body Works (Seminyak):** My favourite – book in advance as gets really busy!! Really well priced – heaps cheaper than Australia and really pampering.
- **Prana Day Spa at The Villa's Hotel (Seminyak):** Looks really lovely – use beautiful products, prices in USD and looks pretty similar to Aussie prices but you probably get much more pampered than you would in Australia and better value for money
- **Melasti Spa** for all your treatments is fantastic. This is at the back of the Melasti Hotel just along from the Mandira (along the water front towards Seminyak). Make sure you try this one!!!
- **Breilla Spa:** My (Jo's) personal favourite. Super clean and super cheap! Opens late and you can make an appointment. <http://briellaspabramagroup.com/>

Taxis:

Make sure you go in a blue metered taxi (they are everywhere!!) just make sure when you get into the taxi that you ask that the metre is on – they will try it on a bit if they think they can. Taxi's are really really cheap! From the airport to Seminyak/Legian /Kuta should cost no more than about 90 000 (rupiah) (\$10) (my last one was 70 000) so use this figure to negotiate. Then around Seminyak/Legian areas all your trips should be really cheap.

Visas/Miscellaneous:

Paid at the airport when you arrive before you go through customs

Entry to Bali

- \$25 USD ✓ (15)
- You also need to allow 150, 000 RP per person when you leave Bali – must be paid in cash

Recommend you bring insect repellent and if you are into it the naturopath in the family recommends B1 vitamin starting 3 days before you leave to go to Bali and take 1- 2 tablets per day until you leave.

THE BARONG KRIS DANCE

The Barong - Play represents an eternal fight between good and evil spirit. Barong (a mythological animal) represents a good spirit and Rangda (a mythological monster) represents an evil one.

THE DANCES START WITH MUSIC OVER TONE

Followed by his friend the monkey, the tiger appears. Three masked dancers appears, representing men making palmwine in the forest, whose children are how killed by the tiger.

The three men get angry and attack the tiger. The tiger is helped by the monkey. During the fight the nose of one of the three men is bitten off.

FIRST ACT.

Two girl-dancers appear, representing the servants of the Rangda, looking for the servants of Dewi Kunti who are on their way to meet their Patih (Prime Minister).

SECOND ACT.

Two servants of Dewi Kunti appear. One of the servants of the Rangda changes into a witch and enters both servants to make them angry. They meet their patih and go together to Dewi Kunti.

THIRD ACT.

Dewi Kunti and her son Sadewa appear. Dewi Kunti has promised the Rangda to sacrifice Sadewa. A witch appears and enters Dewi Kunti. She becomes angry and orders the Patih to bring Sadewa into the forest.

The Patih is also entered by a witch so he does not have pity on Sadewa. Sadewa is then taken into a forest and tied up to a tree.

FOURTH ACT.

Unknown to Rangda, God Siwa, appears and gives Sadewa Immortality. The Rangda appears, ready to kill Sadewa and eat him up but Sadewa is still alive. Rangda then surrenders and asks Sadewa to redeem her, Sadewa becomes angry and kills the Rangda. The Rangda goes into Heaven



FIFTH ACT.

One of the servants of the Rangda called Kalika appears before Sadewa and asks him to redeem her too Sadewa he refuses.

Kalika gets angry, and changes herself into a boar and fights Sadewa. The boar is defeated. She then changes herself into a bird but is defeated again. At last she changes her self into a Rangda, Sadewa meditates and then changes himself into a barong. Still the Rangda seems to be too powerful and the fight is unending. Followers of the Barong appear and help him fight the Rangda.
